Others present included Interim Executive Director Neysa Thomas; Assistant Attorney General Patrick Martin; Director of Security Don Brownlee; Director of Administration Don Cawby; Recording Secretary Linda Pendarvis and other staff.

KANSAS LOTTERY
COMMISSION REPORT:

The commission heard Keith Kocher, director of gaming facilities for the Kansas Lottery, report on the current status of casinos.

LOTTERY GAMING
FACILITY REPORTS/ITEMS:
(F.1.)

Mark Kashuda, general manager of the Boot Hill Casino and Resort (BHCR), appeared for BHCR and reported that:

- BHCR's key staff members were present.
- The casino's total revenue surpassed \$4 million during March 2011, which represents an approximate 12% increase over last year's first quarter.
- Visitation numbers were down about 5%, but wins per customer were up about 18% during March.
- 20% of the total visitors during March ate in the casino's restaurants, which is an approximate 45% increase over last year.
- On responsible gambling and during the month of March, 157 minors were turned away at the door, along with 377 people who had either no ID or an invalid ID. About 75 people were removed for intoxication.
- Attendance at the casino has increased since the events center opened.
- Clark Stewart, president of Butler National Service Corp., announced that a Hampton Inn will be constructed next to the casino.

- Reported that the casino has received more than 3,500 employment applications to date, and that 336 vendors have registered.
- Reported that the casino has awarded 13 construction contracts, 10 of which are Kansas vendors.







 - n. Revised routing of ductwork at selected areas of casino to better coordinate with architectural constraints.
 - o. Revised diffuser layout in high limit table games area to better coordinate with ceiling design.
 - p. Revised HVAC diffuser types in entry vestibules to better coordinate with architectural constraints.
 - q. Revised exhaust ductwork at main production kitchen, and added new rooftop kitchen exhaust fans, to serve exhaust requirements of new dishwasher unit included in equipment revisions noted in item l above.
 - r. ISSUE SUMMARY: At its March meeting, the Commission requested additional information on the Problem Gambling and Addictions Grant Fund in the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services. Specifically, the Commission requested information pertaining to the amount of funds collected and how they have been used and how the Department plans to use the funds in the future. Ray Dalton, Deputy Secretary of SRS Disability and Behavioral Health Services will be present to provide information on the funds and be available to answer the Commission's questions.

FY11 Problem Gambling and Addictions Grant Fund Expenditures






SRS has expended approximately \$409,000 out of the Problem Gambling and Addiction Fund this year specifically on problem gambling initiatives. Based upon the experiences of other states we have utilized a comprehensive approach to address problem gambling which includes the following service components:

- **Treatment:** Effective February 1, 2011, no-cost problem gambling treatment is being provided to problem and pathological gamblers and their significant others. In February, Jeff Marotta, Ph.D., conducted a workshop for providers entitled, “Developing Outpatient Gambling Treatment Programs in Kansas.” In addition, 18 mini grants were awarded to individuals and agencies to provide problem gambling treatment outreach, an initiative to jump-start enrollments into state-subsidized problem gambling treatment. A one-day workshop, entitled, “Conducting Effective Problem Gambling Treatment Outreach,” was held to assist applicants with completing their proposals.
- **Helpline services:** The state contracts with Kansas Health Solutions to provide a 24 hour a day, 7 days a week, problem gambling helpline. Calls are answered by Masters level clinicians. Callers who express a desire to receive help from a trained counselor, are referred immediately.
- **Workforce development:** Monthly, problem gambling clinical supervision conference calls are made available for Kansas Certified Gambling Counselors. The clinical supervision is conducted by Joanna Franklin, a national board approved problem gambling clinical supervisor. Scholarships will be awarded to 10 individuals in Kansas, to attend the Midwest Conference on Problem Gambling and Substance Abuse, scheduled for July 2011.
- **Research and evaluation:** Data regarding gambling behavior was collected in Kansas, for the first time, from a joint effort with Kansas Department of Health and Environment, utilizing the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System Survey (BRFSS). A summary of the results will be available in June.
- **Prevention:** A full time Problem Gambling Specialist began work in March 2011 in Dodge City. This position serves as a resource to the community by providing problem gambling treatment outreach, collaborating with community stakeholders, increasing public awareness about problem gambling, evaluating data, and providing technical assistance to the Southwest Kansas Problem Gambling Task Force. In addition, SRS has contracted with Kansas Family Partnership to develop a clearinghouse for problem gambling literature, videos, books and curriculum. Educational materials were ordered, and brochures, posters and helpline card were printed.
- **Public Awareness:** Public awareness efforts include a website (www.ksgamblinghelp.com) which has been upgraded this fiscal year to include gaming zone community efforts. Each community problem gambling task force can upload meeting agendas, minutes, strategic plans, membership rosters, calendars and speaker’s bureau information. Other efforts include billboards, brochures, helpline cards and public service announcements.
- **The remaining \$350,000 in the Problem Gambling and Addiction Grant Fund is being used to serve more than 200 individuals with substance use disorders who were on waiting lists for state funded treatment services.**
