Diane Giardine, Senior Director of Administration and Support, reported:

- For the month of May 2014, Boot Hill Casino and Resort (BHCR) experienced a decrease in total gaming revenue of 2.18% from April 2014. Table games revenue was up 39.47% while slot revenue was down 6.72%. The revenue changes contributed to an increase in table hold and a decrease in slot hold.
- The Buffalo and Longhorn exhibit opening on Memorial Day weekend located on property of the BHCR and the United Wireless Arena was successful.

Bob Sheldon, General Manager, reported:

- May 2014 revenue numbers compared to May 2013:
 - Total gaming revenue was \$11.7 million, up \$322,000, or 2.8 percent.
 - Table games revenue was \$1.7 million, up 1.4 percent.
 - Slot revenue was \$10.0 million, up 3.1 percent.
- The spring NASCAR race was held in May this year with the Sprint Cup race on Saturday evening which had a prime-time national television broadcast.
- During the week, Hollywood Casino at Kansas Speedway had a meet and greet with NASCAR champion driver Brad Keselowski which was open to the public in Turn 2 Sports Bar.
- Attendance was very strong for the race and table games play was good along with strong food & beverage sales during the race weekend.
- Race viewing events were held for invited customers both in the Turn 2 Sports Bar as well as the exterior patio area behind the casino.

- The number of enrollees in the Voluntary Exclusion Program from the month of May 2014 declined but still above May 2013 enrollees.

Total Gaming Revenue for June 2014 was \$ 10.4MM which was \$302K, or 2.8% less than June of last year.

Slot Revenue was \$9.0MM which was an increase of \$74K or 0.8% over the prior year.

Table Games Revenue was \$1.4MM, which was a decrease of \$376K or 21.2% compared to prior year. This variance was due primarily to a large swing in hold percentage compared to last June which had an abnormally high hold.

The month of June is usually impacted in the early weeks by seasonality. In comparison to last year there was one less Saturday in June 2014 versus June 2013. We were consistent with our marketing/promotional efforts in June. On Friday, June 20th Hollywood held the Grand Prize “Spring into Summer” drawing where one lucky winner walked away with \$15,000 in cash and nine (9) other guests won other prizes in varying amounts.

Background investigations are conducted to protect the public interest by maintaining a legitimate and viable gaming industry assuring honesty, good character and integrity of racing and gaming facility operators, employees, and vendors. 
III. ILLEGAL GAMBLING

The Commission acts as the state's coordinating agency for most illegal gambling questions and complaints. That role requires the KRGC to employ educational, administrative and law enforcement methods to maintain the integrity of gaming in Kansas and to help curtail illegal gambling that occurs in bars, restaurants, convenience stores and other venues throughout Kansas. During the last legislative session, the legislature passed a resolution to put to voters the question of whether to amend the Kansas Constitution to allow raffles for certain non-profit organizations. Raffles are currently illegal in Kansas, which is one of only four states that do not permit charitable raffles. If passed, the regulation of charitable raffles will come under the jurisdiction of the Department of Revenue's Charitable Gaming Division. Effective May 15, 2014, in anticipation of the proposed constitutional amendment passing, KRGC began referring all charitable gambling calls to the Administrator of Charitable Gaming. We expect calls to KRGC related to charitable gambling to decrease over the coming months.

Since 2008, the Commission has received 1,461 total illegal gambling-related questions or complaints from the general public. During the second quarter of 2014, the Commission received thirty-one (31) calls and emails from the general public, down five (5) from the previous quarter and down four (4) from the second quarter of 2013.

Of the thirty-one calls and emails received in Q-2, eleven (11) involved inquiries and complaints involving raffles; two (2) involved poker runs and illegal poker rooms; fourteen (14) pertained to reports of various illegal gambling devices found in bars, restaurants and convenience stores; two (2) concerned internet gambling related to the simulcast of parimutuel races and sports betting; and two (2) calls involved land-based horse racing and casino nights.

Breakdown of illegal gambling inquiries and complaints to-date:



The above chart does not reflect calls and activity related to the following:

- Reports made to KRGC agents by other law enforcement officers around the state.
- Discussions with local law enforcement and district and county attorneys regarding the legal aspects of illegal gambling and the services that KRGC can provide.
- Time spent by agents and legal counsel to assist in active local investigations and prosecutions.
- Time spent pursuing seizures and forfeitures of illegal gambling devices.

- Inquiries from the public that are answered through access to KRGC's Illegal Gambling Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) web page. KRGC updated the FAQs portion of the webpage in late January 2014. During the five months since KRGC began tracking the new page, there have been a total of 156 inquiries to the page. A total of 103 inquiries were made during the third quarter of 2014.
