Others present included Executive Director Richard Petersen-Klein, General Counsel Judith Taylor, Director of Security Don Brownlee, Director of Administration and Finance Brandi White, Director of IT and Electronic Security Dennis Bachman, recording secretary Chris Vega and other staff.

Sharon Stroburg, General Manager, reported:

- For the month of July 2014, Boot Hill Casino and Resort (BHCR) experienced an increase in total gaming revenue of 8.10% over June 2014. Total slot revenue was up 7.64% while table games revenue was up 11.73% over June 2014.
- BHCR had a great opening weekend in August with the Dodge Ram truck giveaway and the Longhorn Cattle Drive. Over 25,000 people watched the Longhorn Cattle Drive from Boot Hill Museum down Wyatt Earp to the RoundUp Rodeo arena. The High Noon Gunfight and the rodeo reported record attendance on Saturday after the cattle drive.

Ms. Stroburg presented BHCR's responsible gambling report to the commission.

Scott Cooper, General Manager, reported:

- July 2014 admissions were down five percent from July 2013.
- Construction of the Kansas Star Casino convention/meeting space and adjacent equestrian building is on schedule for fourth quarter 2014 opening.
- The hotel's 300 rooms are now open.
- Work on the walls for the conference space is ongoing.
- July revenue numbers compared to July 2013:
  - Total gaming revenue down eight percent.
  - Slot coin-in (handle) down eleven percent.
  - Slot hold flat.
  - Table game drop down twelve percent.
  - Table game hold up .4 percent.
  - Poker room revenue up two percent.
- Upcoming events at the Kansas Star Casino Arena are:
  - September 2014 – Team roping and bull riding
  - October 2014 – Roping Championship
  - November 2014 – Belator MMA

Bob Sheldon, General Manager, reported:

- July 2014 revenue numbers compared to July 2013:
  - Total gaming revenue was \$11.0 million, up \$39,000, or 0.4 percent.
  - Table games revenue was \$1.7 million, up \$68,000, or 4.3 percent. Although volume in table games play was down, Hollywood Casino did have a strong hold percentage compared to a below average hold last year, which provided the year over year revenue increase.
  - Slot revenue was \$9.4 million, down \$29,000, or 0.3 percent.
- Hollywood Casino introduced some new mid-week food specials in their Final Cut restaurant, but also continued their summer seasonal specials in their other outlets.
- Hollywood Casino had an official Sporting KC watch party in the Turn 2 sports bar which was well attended by local fans.
- The "Superstar Reels" promotion created a buzz as the jackpot approached its cap of \$25,000 nearing July's end.

Mr. Sheldon presented Hollywood Casino's responsible gambling report to the commission.

The proposed language was revised including the commission's approval authority and provided to the facility managers who indicated the revised language was acceptable.

Mr. Petersen-Klein, reported:

- The semi-annual bingo report will be presented by Department of Revenue Charitable Gambling Coordinator Patsy Congrove at the September commission meeting.
- Enrollment in the Voluntary Exclusion Program has declined slightly, which can be attributed to the end of the KDADS promotion advertising the availability of various problem gambling services in the state.
- KRGC joined a group of KDADS employees that met with the KDADS secretary Kari Bruffett, to discuss problem gambling. Secretary Bruffett's concern was the need for evidence to present to policy makers to measure the effectiveness of gambling addiction treatment. She also noted that the number of people in treatment was low at 133, which raised the question whether additional funding was actually needed.
- KRGC's financial report compares favorably to prior year and

prior months.

- The budgeting process has begun for FY2015, FY2016 and FY2017, which will include numbers for a new casino located in the southeast gaming zone and reconvening of the Lottery Gaming Facility Review Board. The budget, which is due on September 15, will be presented at September's commission meeting.
- The next Commission meeting will be Friday, September 12, 2014 at 10:00 a.m.
- There is a conflict with the Department of Administration's seminar for lawyers on October 17, 2014 and KRGC staff requested a change to move the meeting to Friday, October 10, 2014 or Thursday afternoon on October 16, 2014. The commission meeting was moved to the afternoon of October 16, 2014 at 1:00 p.m.

K. S. A. 79-4715 The director of alcoholic beverage control of the department of revenue shall submit to the Kansas racing and gaming commission semiannual activity reports concerning inspections and investigations of bingo operations in this state.

There were twenty seven on site visits and four telephone interviews conducted between January and the end of June 2014.

Compliance violations during this time period include:

- K.S.A. 79-4705 (a) On dates prescribed by the administrator every operator shall make a return to the administrator upon forms prescribed by the administrator.  
*There were fifteen fines issued to organizations for failure to file reports on time.*
- K.S.A. 79-4705 (y) Each box of instant bingo tickets sold or distributed to licensees shall be accompanied by a flare.  
*A fine was issued for not having the flare available for review by the agent.*
- K.S.A. 79-4706 (u) Every licensee who has gross receipts of \$1,000 or more received from participation in games, shall maintain a bingo trust bank account into which all such receipts are deposited daily.  
*There were two licensees who had fines issued to them for this violation.*

All bingo licenses expired on June 30. Renewals began in May and continue throughout the year. The majority of licensee's wish to play continuously so the majority of the renewals come during May and June.

Raffles: Since May 2014, the Office of Charitable Gaming has been receiving requests for information regarding raffles from Racing and Gaming Commission mailbox and the public. During this period there have been twelve inquiries with one call from a Chief of Police regarding a raffle in his district.

**ISSUE SUMMARY:** The annual budget must be submitted to the Division of the Budget on or before September 15, 2014. Prior to submittal, the Commission approves the Racing and Gaming Commission budget, as well as the State Gaming Agency budget. In the past KRGC would submit revisions to the current year and propose a budget for the upcoming fiscal year. The State of Kansas has gone to a biennial budget for all agencies. Therefore, there are three budget years presented. FY 2015 has been approved by the legislature, but has been revised. FY 2016 and FY 2016 are based on the approved FY 2015 as instructed by the Division of Budget however they have been revised to meet agency needs.

**KRGC General Assumptions**

The FY 2015 revised budget and FY 2016 and FY 2017 are based upon the following assumptions: 1) full year of operation for Boot Hill Casino; 2) full year of operation for Kansas Star Casino; 3) full year of operation for Hollywood Casino; 4) no licensed pari-mutuel racing activity; 5) KRGC staff will administer the Kansas Bred Registry Program; 6) Lottery Gaming Facility Review Board will be operational from January 1, 2015 to December 31, 2015; 7) half of a year of KRGC operational expenses in FY 2016 for the selected gaming facility in the southeast gaming zone; 8) full year of operation in FY 2017 for the selected gaming facility in the southeast gaming zone; 9) KRGC implementation of the Gaming Machine Examination Fund required by K.S.A. 74-8750(c) for the certification of electronic gaming equipment.

**FY 2015**

Each year, agencies are instructed by the Division of Budget to adjust, within appropriation constraints, projected current year expenditures to reflect the most current and realistic estimate of expected expenditures. The KRGC's revised FY 2015 budget is \$6.9 million as compared to the approved FY 2015 budget of \$5.58 million, which is an approximate increase of \$1.32 million or 23.5%. There are several contributing factors to the increase. During the 2014 Legislative Session HB2272 was passed reducing the statutorily defined minimum financial requirements for a destination-type lottery gaming facility (casino) in the southeast gaming zone from \$225 million to \$50 million and the privilege fee from \$25 million dollars to \$5.5 million. The Lottery Gaming Facility Review Board (Board) is anticipated to reconvene in

January of 2015, which will necessitate additional salaries and benefits of \$135,675 for seven Board members, and a part-time temporary unclassified attorney. The Board is expected to require \$299,500 of expenses related to contractual services and commodities in FY 2015. Additionally, the KRGC intends to implement the use of the Gaming Machine Examination Fund (GMEF) required by K.S.A. 74-8750(c) for the certification of electronic gaming equipment. The additional expenses in FY 2015 related to the GMEF include \$155,819 in salaries and benefits (one IT consultant, one administrative assistant, and one accountant), \$561,546 in contractual expenses, and \$192,000 in capital outlay for a total of \$909,365 in expenses. The capital outlay expenses are for an enhancement to KRGC's electronic gaming equipment inventory tracking system, which provides the State with an electronic mechanism for reviewing gaming software and hardware that has been approved, denied, or revoked for use in Kansas. The enhancement for gaming equipment examinations in FY 2015 also includes two additional gaming facility EGM electronic security agents. Costs related to the GMEF will be collected from gaming equipment manufacturers submitting gaming equipment for use in Kansas. KRGC requests that the GMEF be re-established as a no-limit fee fund to meet the requirements of K.S.A. 74-8750(c). KRGC has assumed a shrinkage rate of 2% for FY 2015 which totals a shrinkage amount of \$91,753.

The approved FY 2015 budget includes 67.45 FTE positions. The revised FY 2015 requests a total of 72.45 FTE positions, which is an addition of 5 FTE positions consisting of 3 regular unclassified and 2 regular classified positions. The total FTE number including the requested additional positions will be composed of 48 regular classified positions, 24.45 regular unclassified positions, and 14.75 part-time temporary unclassified positions, which consists of 5 Commissioners, 7 Board members, 1 filled position, and 1.75 unfilled positions. The total FTE number requested is 72.45 because the part-time temporary unclassified positions do not count in the FTE number under budget policy and procedure guidelines.

There is no expected racing related expenses in FY 2015, with the exception of record storage costs and the costs related to operating the Kansas Bred Registry by the agency. Costs related to these two items are not expected to be significant. Fees will be charged for horses registered with the Kansas Bred Registry.

The budget includes a request to expend from the Illegal Gaming Enforcement fund for operations related to seizure of illegal gambling devices. Funding derived from seizures of illegal gambling devices is authorized by appropriations. The fund is restricted to use for investigatory activities related to illegal gaming.

**FY 2016**

The KRGC's requested FY 2016 budget is \$8.6 million compared to the revised FY 2015 budget of \$6.9 million which is an increase of \$1.7 million or 24.6% over the revised FY 2015 budget. The increase is due to three factors. The first, KRGC anticipates that the Board may continue to meet for the first six months of FY 2016. It is estimated that in FY 2016 the Board will expend a total of \$453,000 compared to a total of \$435,000 in total expenditures for revised FY 2015 consisting of an additional \$20,000 for contractual services. The second factor is for the continuation of the GMEF required by K.S.A. 74-8750(c) for the certification of electronic gaming equipment. The estimated total costs in FY 2016 related to the certification of electronic gaming equipment are \$1.6 million compared to a total of \$909,365 in revised FY 2015 consisting of an additional \$79,000 in salaries and benefits and \$627,000 for contractual services or an increase of \$706,000 over revised FY 2015. The third factor contributing to increased costs in FY 2016 is the anticipated operation of a southeast gaming zone facility. The estimated costs related to start-up regulatory costs are \$944,745 consisting of \$755,000 in salaries and benefits, \$82,208 in contractual services, \$23,660 in commodities, and \$83,875 in capital outlay. KRGC has assumed a shrinkage rate of 2% for FY 2016 which totals a shrinkage amount of \$110,000.

The requested FY 2016 budget reflects an increase of 19 FTE positions compared to the revised FY 2015 budget, or an increase from 72.45 to 91.45 FTE. The increase is a result of adding 11 enforcement agents, 1 public service executive, 1 administrative officer, 1 senior administrative assistant, 1 accountant, 1 auditor, 1 attorney, and 2 IT consultants.

Pari-mutuel racing expenses for FY 2016 are expected to be minimal with records storage costs and the administration of the Kansas-Bred Registry Program being the only expenditures.

The budget includes a request to expend from the Illegal Gaming Enforcement fund for operations related to seizure of illegal gambling devices. Funding derived from seizures of illegal gambling devices is authorized by appropriations. The fund is restricted to use for investigatory activities related to illegal gaming.

**FY 2017**

The KRGC's requested FY 2017 budget is \$8.77 million compared to the requested FY 2016 budget of \$8.6 million and is a 2% increase over the requested FY 2016 budget. The increase of \$170,000 is a combination of increased regulatory costs for the southeast gaming zone facility and decreased Board expenditures as a result of the conclusion of Board duties. KRGC has assumed a shrinkage rate of 2% for FY 2017 which totals a shrinkage amount of approximately \$129,000.

The number of FTE requested for the FY 2017 budget is unchanged compared to the requested FY 2016 budget, which totals 91.45 FTE. This FTE number is composed of one part-time unclassified regular position and a part-time unclassified temporary position.

Pari-mutuel racing expenses for FY 2017 are expected to be minimal with records storage costs and the administration of the Kansas-Bred Registry Program being the only expenditures.

Mark Dodd from the State Gaming Agency will present its budget.

**COMMISSION ACTION REQUIRED/REQUESTED:** Commission discussion, consideration and approval of the revised FY 2015 and the requested FY 2016 and FY 2017 budgets for the Racing & Gaming Commission and the State Gaming Agency.

**STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:** Staff recommends approval of the proposed budget, subject to technical changes to be made upon entering the budget into IBARS, the State Budget System and to potential future changes made by Division of Budget, the Governor and the Legislature.

**KRGC Statutory History**

In 1986, Article 15, Section 3 of the Kansas Constitution was amended by Kansas voters to permit pari-mutuel wagering on horse and greyhound races. The Kansas Pari-mutuel Racing Act was enacted by the Kansas Legislature in 1987 setting forth the terms and conditions of the agency’s operation as enumerated in Chapter 74, Article 88 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated (KSA). The powers and duties of the Kansas Racing Commission, as it was originally named, may be found in K.S.A. 74-8804, as amended. In 1996, the Kansas Racing Commission was renamed the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission (KRGC) pursuant to K.S.A. 74-8803a.

In 2007, the Kansas Legislature enacted the Kansas Expanded Lottery Act (KELA), which is found in K.S.A. 74-8733 through 74-8773. Under KELA, the Kansas Lottery is authorized to own and operate casino-style games, including slot machines and table games, in specified geographical gaming zones, as well as pari-mutuel racetrack facilities located within certain of those gaming zones. The KRGC, under KELA, regulates and licenses lottery and racetrack gaming facility managers under contract with the Kansas Lottery to operate the games owned by the Kansas Lottery. In addition, the KRGC licenses gaming and non-gaming suppliers used by lottery or racetrack gaming facility managers.

**State Gaming Agency Executive and Statutory History**

In 1995, the State of Kansas by Executive Order No. 95-177 designated the Kansas Department of Commerce & Housing as the State Gaming Agency to carry out certain duties and responsibilities under the gaming compacts entered into with resident Native American Tribes until the Kansas Legislature could enact legislation to designate a permanent State Gaming Agency.

In 1996, the Kansas Legislature enacted the Tribal Gaming Oversight Act, which is set forth in K.S.A. 74-9801 through 74-9809, as amended. Under K.S.A. 74-9803, the State Gaming Agency was attached to the KRGC for budget purposes, human resource assistance, and dispute resolution under the terms of the tribal-state gaming compacts. All other management functions of the State Gaming Agency are administered by its executive director. (See Tribal Gaming Program narrative)

In addition, KELA authorized the operation of slot machines at pari-mutuel racetrack facilities under specific conditions. Three lottery gaming facilities have been construed to date and are in operation in the southwest, northeast and south-central gaming zones. The southeast gaming zone remains available for a lottery gaming facility. Legislation reduced the statutorily defined minimum financial requirements and the privilege fee for the southeast gaming zone. The Kansas Lottery is receiving applications from parties interested in constructing and operating a gaming facility in either Crawford or Cherokee county through December 19, 2014. The Lottery Gaming Facility Review Board is expected to approve a contract by the end of the first half of FY 2016 for the southeast gaming zone. Additionally, no licensed pari-mutuel racetrack facilities currently exist in Kansas.

In December 2009 the Boot Hill Casino & Resort (Boot Hill Casino) began operations in Dodge City, Kansas in the southwest gaming zone. Boot Hill Casino has over 600 state-owned slot machines, 16 table games and 5 poker tables. The Boot Hill Casino is flanked on one side by the Dodge City/Ford County United Wireless events and convention center, which includes a 6,000 seat arena, and on the other side by a Hampton Inn that opened in March 2012.

In 2010, Peninsula Gaming, LLC (Peninsula) was selected as the lottery gaming facility manager for the south-central gaming zone. Peninsula constructed a temporary gaming facility known as the Kansas Star Arena Casino that opened in December 2011 in Mulvane, Kansas. The Kansas Star Casino's permanent gaming facility with several dining options opened in December 2012. A connected Hampton Inn with 150 rooms opened in November 2012 and an additional 150 hotel rooms opened in July 2014. The temporary gaming facility has been reconfigured into an entertainment facility. The final phase of the gaming enterprise will include a number of stables and other equestrian facilities, as well as an event and a convention center. The convention center and the equestrian facilities are expected to be completed in 2015. In addition, the equestrian center is expected to open in 2015. Boyd Gaming, Inc. acquired 100% of Peninsula in an equity transaction in November 2012.

The third lottery gaming facility is located in the northeast gaming zone and opened February 2012 in Wyandotte County. The facility, known as the Hollywood Casino at Kansas Speedway (Hollywood Casino), is operated by Kansas Entertainment, LLC, which is a joint venture between Penn National Gaming, Inc. and International Speedway, Corp. International Speedway, Corp. owns and operates the Kansas Speedway and the Hollywood Casino is located on turn two of the Kansas Speedway.

Effective July 1, 2014 House Bill 2272 became law without the Governor's signature. House Bill 2272 reduced the statutorily defined minimum financial requirements for a destination-type casino in the southeast gaming zone from \$225 million to \$50 million and the privilege fee from \$25 million dollars to \$5.5 million. The Lottery Gaming Facility Review Board is expected to reconvene in January of 2015.

**KRGC General Assumptions**

The FY 2015 revised budget and FY 2016 and FY 2017 are based upon the following assumptions: 1) full year of operation for Boot Hill Casino; 2) full year of operation for Kansas Star Casino; 3) full year of operation for Hollywood Casino; 4) no licensed pari-mutuel racing activity; 5) KRGC staff will administer the Kansas Bred Registry Program; 6) Lottery Gaming Facility Review Board will be operational from January 1, 2015 to December 31, 2015; 7) half of a year of KRGC operational expenses in FY 2016 for the selected gaming facility in the southeast gaming zone; 8) full year of operation in FY 2017 for the selected gaming facility in the southeast gaming zone; 9) KRGC implementation of the Gaming Machine Examination Fund required by K.S.A. 74-8750(c) for the certification of electronic gaming equipment.

The Kansas Bred Registry Program registers Kansas bred horses in various categories for the purpose of distributing moneys credited to the Kansas horse breeding development fund. Distributions from this fund include purse supplements, stakes and awards, and equine research. The registry was previously administered under a contract that expired between the KRGC and the Kansas Horsemen's Association. Although licensed pari-mutuel racing activities are presently dormant, interest in encouraging a resumption of such activities has been high, which warrants the continuation of the registry program. It is also assumed that the KRGC will assume the responsibilities of the Kansas Greyhound Association regarding the administration of the Kansas bred greyhound registry in the future. Under current conditions funding for the maintenance of the registry programs will come from existing State Racing Funds and registration fees deposited into the State Racing Fund.

The KRGC renews its request to continue the practice of using no-limit fee funds for all funds, thus allowing the necessary flexibility to regulate racing and gaming activities as conditions change. Additionally, the KRGC has requested that the current balances in all funds related to pari-mutuel activities be maintained in the event licensed pari-mutuel racing activity resumes in Kansas and to fund the administration of the registry programs. KRGC also requests that the Gaming Machine Examination Fund (2998) be re-established as a no-limit fee fund. The Gaming Machine Examination Fund is required to meet requirements of K.S.A. 74-8750(c), all revenues received will be from electronic gaming machine manufacturers and any unused funds will be returned to the appropriate vendor.

**Current Year Comparison of FY 2015 Approved and Revised Budget Expenditures**

The KRGC's revised FY 2015 budget is \$6.9 million as compared to the approved FY 2015 budget of \$5.58 million, which is an increase of \$1.32 million or 23.5%. There are several contributing factors to the increase. During the 2014 Legislative Session HB2272 was passed reducing the statutorily defined minimum financial requirements for a destination-type lottery gaming facility (casino) in the southeast gaming zone from \$225 million to \$50 million and the privilege fee from \$25 million dollars to \$5.5 million. The Lottery Gaming Facility Review Board (Board) is anticipated to reconvene in January of 2015, which will necessitate additional salaries and benefits of \$135,675 for seven Board members, and a part-time temporary unclassified attorney. The Board is expected to require \$299,500 of expenses related to contractual services and commodities in FY 2015. Additionally, the KRGC intends to implement the use of the Gaming Machine Examination Fund required by K.S.A. 74-8750(c) for the certification of electronic gaming equipment. KRGC requests that the Gaming Machine Examination Fund be re-established as a no-limit fee fund for the purpose of receiving certification fees from electronic gaming machine manufacturers to meet the requirements of K.S.A. 74-8750(c). All revenues received for the Gaming Machine Examination Fund will be from electronic gaming equipment manufacturers and any unused funds will be returned to the appropriate vendor. The additional expenses in FY 2015 related to the Gaming Machine Examination Fund include \$155,819 in salaries and benefits (two EGM security agents, one IT consultant, one administrative assistant, and one accountant), \$561,546 in contractual expenses, and \$192,000 in capital outlay for a total of \$909,365 in expenses. The capital outlay expenses are for an enhancement to KRGC's electronic gaming equipment inventory tracking system, which provides the State with an electronic mechanism for reviewing gaming software and hardware that has been approved, denied, or revoked for use in Kansas. The enhancement for gaming equipment examinations in FY 2015 also includes two additional gaming facility EGM electronic security agents. KRGC has assumed a shrinkage rate of 2% for FY 2015 which totals a shrinkage amount of \$91,753.

The revised FY 2015 budget reflects an increase of 5 full-time equivalent (FTE) positions compared to the approved FY 2015 budget, or an increase from 67.45 FTE total positions to 72.45 FTE. As a matter of budget policy and procedure the FTE count does not include one part-time unclassified regular position and two part-time unclassified temporary position.

Pari-mutuel racing expenses for FY 2015 are expected to be minimal with records storage costs and the administration of the Kansas-Bred Registry Program being the only expenditures.

**Budget Year – Comparison of FY 2016 and FY 2015 Revised Budget Expenditures**

The KRGC's requested FY 2016 budget is \$8.6 million compared to the revised FY 2015 budget of \$6.9 million which is an increase of \$1.7 million or 24.6% over the revised FY 2015 budget. The increase is due to the addition of three change packages. The first change package is the anticipated costs related to the Board for the first six months of FY 2016. It is estimated that in FY 2016 the Board will expend a total of \$453,000 compared to a total of \$435,000 in total expenditures for revised FY 2015 consisting of an additional \$20,000 for contractual services. The second change package is for the implementation of the Gaming Machine Examination Fund required by K.S.A. 74-8750(c) for the certification of electronic gaming equipment. The estimated total costs in FY 2016 related to the certification of electronic gaming equipment are \$1.6 million compared to a total of \$909,365 consisting of an additional \$79,000 in salaries and benefits and \$627,000 for contractual services for a total of \$706,000. KRGC requests that the Gaming Machine Examination Fund be re-established as a no-limit fee fund for the purposes of receiving certification fees from electronic gaming equipment manufacturers to meet the requirements of K.S.A. 74-8750(c). All revenues received for the Gaming Machine Examination Fund will be from electronic gaming equipment manufacturers and any unused funds will be returned to the appropriate vendor. The third change package in FY 2016 is for the anticipated KRGC start-up costs for the southeast gaming zone facility. The estimated costs related to the start-up regulatory costs are \$944,745 consisting of \$755,000 in salaries and benefits, \$82,208 in contractual services, \$23,660 in commodities, and \$83,875 in capital outlay. KRGC has assumed a shrinkage rate of 2% for FY 2016 which totals a shrinkage amount of \$110,000.

The requested FY 2016 budget reflects an increase of 19 FTE positions compared to the revised FY 2015 budget, or an increase from 72.45 to 91.45 FTE. to a total of 91.45 FTE which is an increase of 19. The increase is a result of adding 11 enforcement agents, 1 public service executive, 1 administrative officer, 1 senior administrative assistant, 1 accountant, 1 auditor, 1 attorney, and 2 IT consultants. The FTE number does not include one part-time unclassified regular position and a part-time unclassified temporary position under budget policy and procedure guidelines.

Pari-mutuel racing expenses for FY 2016 are expected to be minimal with records storage costs and the administration of the Kansas-Bred Registry Program being the only expenditures.

**Budget Year – Comparison of FY 2017 and FY 2016 Requested Budget Expenditures**

The KRGC's requested FY 2017 budget is \$8.77 million compared to the requested FY 2016 budget of \$8.6 million and is a 2% increase over the requested FY 2016 budget. The increase of \$170,000 is a combination of increased regulatory costs for the southeast gaming zone facility and decreased Board expenditures as a result of the conclusion of Board duties. KRGC has assumed a shrinkage rate of 2% for FY 2017 which totals a shrinkage amount of approximately \$129,000.

The number of FTE positions requested for the FY 2017 budget is unchanged compared to the requested FY 2016 budget, which totals 91.45 FTE. This FTE number is composed of one part-time unclassified regular position and a part-time unclassified temporary position. The FTE number does not include one part-time unclassified regular position and a part-time unclassified temporary position.

Pari-mutuel racing expenses for FY 2017 are expected to be minimal with records storage costs and the administration of the Kansas-Bred Registry Program being the only expenditures.

**KRGC Revenues**

All expenditures by the KRGC are currently paid by the lottery gaming facility managers with the exception of costs associated with the licensing of vendors who pay their own costs. Expenditures are allocated between direct and indirect costs with direct costs being those expenditures identified with a specific lottery gaming facility manager, which primarily includes the cost of the KRGC staff located at each lottery gaming facility. Direct costs account for 65% of total costs. The remaining 35% of total costs are indirect costs that are primarily associated with the Topeka office, and are generally allocated among the lottery gaming facility managers based upon a number of factors (i.e. revenues, direct expenses, number of slot machines and table games, number of employees, etc.). In order for the KRGC to be completely self-funded it bills the lottery gaming facility managers quarterly in advance based upon approved budget expenditures. The first quarterly billings were for six months each to establish the necessary cash balances for ongoing operations. Currently, the KRGC bills for the quarter representing 4-6 months in the future and reconciles quarterly billings to actual expenditures for the quarter just ended making the necessary adjustments to the quarterly billing.

The lottery gaming facility managers also remit payments to cover the cost of the background investigations of their employees. As noted above, certain vendors doing business with lottery gaming facility managers also remit payments to cover the cost of their background investigations. Up front deposits are required based upon an estimate of the total background cost and are supplemented with additional payments if the amount of the deposit is insufficient to cover the actual costs incurred as the background investigation progresses. If the payments received exceed the background costs incurred, the vendor is sent a refund of the unused funds.

Revenues received in the Gaming Machine Examination Fund will be from electronic gaming equipment manufacturers for the certification of gaming hardware and software as stipulated by K.S.A. 74-8750(c). Manufacturers will submit funds to KRGC in advance of submitting products for certification to designated gaming laboratories. KRGC will submit payments to the gaming laboratories at the completion of testing services. Manufacturers will pay KRGC expenses related to the administration of this process. KRGC requests that the Gaming Machine Examination Fund be re-established as a no-limit fee fund for this purpose.

**Review of KRGC Prior Year - 2014**

**Racing Program**

KRGC FY 2014 expenditures of \$7,957 were related to the storage of racing programs at the Kansas Historical Society and salaries and wages related to administering the Kansas Horse Registry and regulation of the Kansas Greyhound Registry.

**Expanded Lottery Act Gaming Program**

KRGC expenditures for FY 2014 reflect the costs of ongoing regulatory oversight for Boot Hill Casino & Resort, Kansas Star Casino, and Hollywood Casino at Kansas Speedway. Total actual FY 2014 expenditures were approximately \$500,000 or 8.9% below budget at \$5.13 million compared to budgeted expenditures of \$5.6 million. Contractual services, capital outlays and commodities were below budget by \$139,000, net salaries and wages including benefits were under budget by \$350,000.

**RACING PROGRAM**

**State Racing Fund - 5131**

K.S.A 74-8826 established the State Racing Fund. All taxes on pari-mutuel wagering, admission tax, application fees and fines must be credited to the fund. The Racing Program is currently on hold as all tracks in the State have ceased operations.

This budget assumes there will be no racing activity to generate revenues or expenditures to this fund in FY 2015, FY 2016, or FY 2017. The operating transfer into the fund in FY 2011 represents the transfer of the outstanding balances in the Horse Fair Racing Benefit Fund, the Racing Investigative Expense Fund, and the Racing Reimbursable Expense Fund to the State Racing Fund at the end of FY 2011. The estimated revenues projected in FY 2015, FY 2016, and FY 2017 are attributed to fees charged for the registration of horses and greyhounds for the Kansas Bred Registry Programs. The registration of horses was formerly administered by the Kansas Horsemen's Association but will now be done by KRGC staff. Additionally, the greyhound registry is currently maintained by the Kansas Greyhound Association and KRGC expects to administer the program in the future.

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**Horse Fair Racing Benefit Fund - 2296**

K.S.A. 74-8838 states that one-third of the simulcast pari-mutuel tax be credited to the County Fair Horse Racing Benefit Fund. Moneys in the horse fair racing benefit fund shall be expended for the following fair meet associated costs: the commission's regulatory costs, tote board expenses, background investigations for fair association or associated non-profit organization's members, purse supplements, operating assistance grants, and the employment of key race officials. The only exception is that the statute allows 25% of moneys credited to the fund, on approval by the Commission, to be used for capital improvements to racetrack facilities.

K.S.A. 74-8747 directs that 1% of net electronic gaming machine income from racetrack facilities be deposited in the Horse Fair Racing Benefit Fund.

**Racing Investigative Expense Fund - 2570**

K.S.A. 74-8835 established the Racing Investigative Expense Fund and requires that all receipts other than the application fee received for licensure of facility owners or organizational licensees are to be deposited to the Racing Investigative Expense Fund. Moneys in the fund are to be used for expenses of investigation of an applicant's qualifications for an organization license, facility owner license or facility manager license.

**Greyhound Breeding Development Fund - 2601**

K.S.A. 74-8831 established the Greyhound Breeding Development Fund and requires that all moneys credited to this fund be used only for the benefit of greyhounds. **Greyhound Promotion and Development Fund - 2561**

**EXPANDED GAMING PROGRAM**

**Expanded Lottery Act Regulation Fund - 2535**

The Kansas Expanded Lottery Act specifies that the cost of regulation is to be incurred by the lottery gaming facility managers. In 2007, the KRGC obtained a loan from the PMIB to finance expanded gaming regulation until the lottery gaming facility managers were selected and approved. During the 2008 legislative session, the amount of the loan from PMIB was increased to \$5,000,000 to cover KRGC operating costs for FY 2009 and FY 2010 and the term of the loan was extended through FY 2012. The balance of the loan was repaid in FY 2012.

Revenue projections for FY 2015, FY 2016 and FY 2017 include billings and payments from the currently operating casinos for the KRGC's direct and indirect costs associated with the operations of the Hollywood Casino, the Kansas Star Casino and the Boot Hill Casino. Payments are received in advance of expenditure on a quarterly billing cycle.

**Education and Training Fund - 2459**

The KRGC Education and Training Fee Fund is established by appropriations act and its purpose is to allow the KRGC to receive and expend funds for training opportunities that could be offered to others outside of the KRGC. This fund is not budgeted and is used only as training opportunities arise. In FY 2015, FY 2016 and FY 2017, time permitting, we plan to seek out training opportunities for in-house staff and to invite employees from other agencies to help offset our training costs.

**Illegal Gaming Enforcement Fund - 2734**

The KRGC became the primary coordinator for state-level illegal gambling complaints after the passage of the Expanded Lottery Act, but no funds were appropriated for its activities. The Illegal Gaming Enforcement Fund was established during the 2011 legislative session and initial funding of \$5,000 was provided via a transfer from the state racing fund. A proviso was included that would allow KRGC the ability to retain funds seized as part of illegal gaming enforcement operations. For this budget submission we would again request that the proviso included for the FY 2015 appropriations act be retained for the FY 2016 and FY 2017 appropriations.

- (1) A proviso that would allow KRGC the ability to retain funds seized as part of illegal gaming enforcement operations and deposited into the fund to be used for illegal gaming enforcement activities.
- (2) A proviso that would allow the KRGC to receive moneys from state or federal seizures or awards related to illegal gaming enforcement activities of the agency.
- (3) The fund is a no-limit fund so that monies may be used in a timely manner for enforcement activities.

**RACING PROGRAM**

**K.S.A. 74-8804 (a)** through (q) require the commission to observe and inspect all racetrack facilities; administer oaths and take depositions; examine any books, paper records or memoranda of any licensee, racetrack or business involved in simulcasting races to racetrack facilities in Kansas; issue subpoenas; allocate race meeting dates, racing days, and hours to all organization licensees; authority to exclude, or cause to be expelled from any race meeting or racetrack facility or to prohibit a licensee from conducting business with any person who has violated the provision of this act or any rule and regulation or order of the commission, been convicted of a violation of the racing or gambling laws or has been adjudicated of committing as a juvenile an act which if committed by an adult, would constitute such a violation, whose person reflects adversely on the honesty and integrity of horse or greyhound racing or interferes with the conduct of a race meeting; review and approve all proposed construction and major renovations to racetrack facilities; review and approve all proposed contracts with racetracks or businesses involved in simulcasting races to racetrack facilities in Kansas; suspend a horse or greyhound from participation in races; impose a civil fine; adopt rules and regulations and require fingerprinting and background information of all persons for employment, license or simulcasting license.

**PROGRAM GOAL**

To maintain the integrity of pari-mutuel wagering systems and to protect the public and the health, safety and welfare of the racing animal.

The KRGC provides regulatory oversight of lottery and racetrack gaming facility managers and their operations in Kansas. Currently, no racetrack gaming facility managers are licensed in Kansas.

**PROGRAM'S STATUTORY HISTORY:**

Under KELA, the State of Kansas is authorized to contract with entities to operate casino-style games owned by the Kansas Lottery Commission. KELA established four gaming zones where lottery gaming facilities could be located and exclusively operated. Additionally, KELA provided that the Kansas Lottery Commission was authorized to contract with racetrack gaming facility managers in three of the four gaming zones to operate slots machines at pari-mutuel facilities.

K.S.A. 74-8772 requires the KRGC to establish and enforce rules and regulations that include but are not limited to: 1) promoting the integrity of gaming and the finances of gaming activity in Kansas that meet or exceed industry standards for monitoring and controlling lottery and racetrack gaming facility managers; 2) prescribing the on-site security at lottery and racetrack gaming facility enterprises in Kansas; 3) reporting of information concerning lottery and racetrack facility managers, their employees, vendors and vendor finances necessary or desirable to ensure the security of lottery or racetrack gaming facility operations; and 4) reporting and auditing of the financial information of lottery or racetrack gaming facility managers, and other information the KRGC requires to determine compliance with KELA and KRGC rules and regulations. KRGC rules and regulations shall include but not be limited to oversight provisions related to: 1) internal controls; 2) security of facilities; 3) performance of background investigations; 4) determination of qualifications and credentialing of employees, contractors and agents of lottery or racetrack gaming facility managers, ancillary lottery gaming facility operations and racetrack gaming facilities; 5) auditing of lottery gaming facility revenue and racetrack gaming facility slot machine income; 6) enforcement of all state laws; and 7) maintaining of the integrity of lottery and racetrack gaming facility operations.

K.S.A. 74-8769 requires that each person subject to a background check under KELA shall be subject to a state and national criminal history records check that conforms to federal standards for the purpose of verifying an applicant's identity and determining whether the applicant has been convicted of any crime that would disqualify the applicant from engaging in activities at lottery or racetrack gaming facilities or ancillary lottery gaming facilities.

K.S.A. 74-8710(a)(13)(B) states that the Kansas Lottery Commission must issue rules and regulations to enforce management contract provisions that require lottery and racetrack gaming facility managers to provide a program to alleviate problem gambling including a requirement that each lottery and racetrack gaming facility maintain a self-exclusion list by which individuals may exclude themselves from access to slots machines and other lottery facility games. Under K.S.A. 74-8772, the KRGC issues rules and regulations to provide regulatory oversight of these management contract provisions that include responsible gambling and voluntary exclusion programs.

K.S.A. 74-8750(c) requires the KRGC to collect from any manufacturer, supplier, provider, lottery gaming facility manager, racetrack gaming facility manager or other person the anticipated actual costs in advance for the examination and certification of electronic gaming machines or lottery facility games. KRGC will reimburse any overpayment and collect any under payment from the appropriate vendor.

**Prior Year - FY 2014**

Salaries for the prior year were for the KRGC's employees at the central office in Topeka, the Boot Hill Casino in Dodge City, the Kansas Star Casino in Mulvane, and the Hollywood Casino at the Kansas Speedway in Wyandotte county. The KRGC had an approved FTE limit of 67.45. The FTEs consist of 46 regular classified positions and 21.45 regular unclassified positions. In addition, KRGC has 5 commissioners, all of which are non-FTE temporary unclassified.

**Current Year FY 2015**

Salaries and wages for the current year are for the KRGC employees that regulate gaming from the central office in Topeka, the Boot Hill Casino, the Kansas Star Casino, and the Hollywood Casino. The KRGC has an approved FTE limit of 67.45 FTE positions for FY 2015. In addition, the KRGC funds a 0.5 temporary unclassified position, 5 KRGC Commissioners in the temporary unclassified service. KRGC has requested additional positions for FY 2015 as described below in the supplemental information.

K.S.A. 74-8773 authorizes the agency to employ such officers and employees as the commission deems necessary to implement, administer and enforce the provisions of KELA, with the limitation that no more than 25 employees may be in the unclassified service. K.S.A. 74-8805 authorizes the agency to employ two persons in the unclassified service. For the current year, the agency budgets for 24.45 employees in the regular unclassified service.

**Budget Year - Base Budget FY 2016**

Salaries and wages for FY 2016 are for the KRGC employees that regulate gaming from the central office in Topeka, the Boot Hill Casino, the Kansas Star Casino, and the Hollywood Casino. The KRGC has an approved FTE limit of 67.45 FTE positions for FY 2015. In addition, the KRGC funds a 0.5 temporary unclassified position, 5 KRGC Commissioners in the temporary unclassified service. KRGC has requested additional positions for FY 2016 as described below in the supplemental information.

**Budget Year - Base Budget FY 2017**

Salaries and wages for FY 2017 are for the KRGC employees that regulate gaming from the central office in Topeka, the Boot Hill Casino, the Kansas Star Casino, and the Hollywood Casino. The KRGC has an approved FTE limit of 67.45 FTE positions for FY 2015. In addition, the KRGC funds a 0.5 temporary unclassified position, 5 KRGC Commissioners in the temporary unclassified service. KRGC has requested additional positions for FY 2017 as described below in the supplemental information.

**Budget Year 2015- Supplemental**

KRGC has requested two change packages for FY 2015. The first request is the addition of two regular classified positions and three regular unclassified positions. These positions will serve to implement the Gaming Machine Examination Fund required by K.S.A. 74-8750(c) for the certification of electronic gaming equipment. The second change package requests the addition of 7.5 part-time temporary unclassified positions for an attorney and the members of the Board related to the passage of HB 2272 during the 2014 legislative session. The FTE number including the requested additional positions will be composed of 48 regular classified positions, 24.45 regular unclassified positions, and 14.75 part-time temporary unclassified positions, which consists of 5 Commissioners, 7 Board members, 1 filled position, and 1.75 unfilled positions. The total FTE number requested is 72.45 because the part-time temporary unclassified positions do not count in the FTE number under budget policy and procedure guidelines.

**Budget Year 2016- Supplemental**

KRGC has requested three change packages for FY 2016. The first change package request is related to the implementation of the Gaming Machine Examination Fund required by K.S.A. 74-8750(c) for the certification of electronic gaming equipment, but KRGC is not requesting any additional positions other than those requested in FY 2015. The second change package is related to the continuation of the Board for the first half of FY 2016, but the KRGC is not requesting any additional positions other than the ones requested in the FY 2015 supplemental package for the Board. The third change package request is for the addition of seventeen regular classified positions and two regular unclassified positions related to the anticipated opening of the southeast gaming facility with ten regular classified positions and one regular unclassified position located at the gaming facility, and seven regular classified positions and one regular unclassified position located in Topeka. The number of FTE positions for FY 2016 increases by nineteen positions compared to the total number of FTE positions requested for FY 2015 for a total of 91.45 FTE positions for FY 2016 consisting of 65 regular classified positions, 26.45 regular unclassified positions, and 14.25 part-time temporary unclassified positions. Part-time temporary unclassified positions do not figure into the FTE count total under budget policy and procedure guidelines.

**Budget Year 2017- Supplemental**

The KRGC has requested two change packages for FY 2017. The first change package request is related to the implementation of the Gaming Machine Examination Fund required by K.S.A. 74-8750(c) for the certification of electronic gaming equipment, but the KRGC is not requesting any additional positions other than those requested in the FY 2015 and FY 2016 supplemental packages. The second change package request is related to the anticipated opening of a southeast gaming zone facility, but the KRGC is not requesting any additional positions other than those requested in the FY 2016 supplemental package. The total FTE positions for FY 2017 are unchanged from the total FTE positions requested for FY 2016 at a total of 91.45 FTE positions for the base budget in FY 2017. The total number of FTE positions for FY 2017 consists of 65 regular classified positions, 26.45 regular unclassified positions, and 14.75 part-time temporary unclassified positions. Part-time temporary unclassified positions do not figure into the FTE count total under budget policy and procedure guidelines.

**Prior Year - FY 2014**

The majority of contractual expenditures for FY 2014 are for the regulation of the three lottery gaming facilities currently operating. Expenses for central administration primarily consist of rent and monument charge (\$169,506), and fees related to background investigations.

**Current Year - FY 2015**

FY 2015 contractual services include expenditures for ongoing operations associated with the regulation of the Boot Hill Casino in Dodge City, the Hollywood Casino in Wyandotte county, and the Kansas Star Casino near Mulvane. In addition expenditures include expenses related to the administration of the Board and the implementation of the Gaming Machine Examination Fund required by K.S.A. 74-8750(c) for the certification of electronic gaming equipment. Travel and subsistence is for performing internal control audits at gaming facilities; voluntary exclusion program audits; electronic gaming equipment and security audits; background investigations of casino employees; agent and employee training; travel for the Board; fees and professional services largely consisting of database access fees (i.e. KBI database) related to background checks for gaming facility employees; consultants for the Board. The majority of rental cost is Topeka office space and monument charge in the Eisenhower State Office Building (note monument charge on ESOB office space is included in Fees-other services). Costs from the Gaming Background Investigations fund are related to background checks of vendors who are providing goods and services to the gaming facilities. Costs from Gaming Machine Examination Fund are primarily related to the certification of electronic gaming equipment for use in the state of Kansas.

**Enhancement**

There are two enhancement packages for FY 2015. KRGC has requested additional funding to reconvene the Lottery Gaming Facility Review Board as required by the passage of House Bill 2272 in the 2014 legislative session. Approximately, \$300,000 of contractual expenses are budgeted for the Board in FY 2015. KRGC has also requested additional funding to implement the Gaming Machine Examination Fund required by K.S.A. 74-8750(c) for the certification of electronic gaming machine equipment. For FY 2015 approximately \$560,000 in contractual services are budgeted for the testing and certification of electronic gaming equipment.

**Budget Year - Base Budget FY 2016**

The budget year reflects costs for the ongoing expanded gaming regulation of the three operational lottery gaming facilities, the Board, and the start-up of a gaming facility in the southeast gaming zone.

NOTE: The KRGC requests to continue the Hospitality Fund in the amount of \$1,500 for purpose of hosting public meetings.

**Enhancement**

There are three enhancement requests for FY 2016. KRGC has requested additional funding to reconvene the Board as required by the passage of House Bill 2272 in the 2014 legislative session. Approximately \$350,000 of contractual services are budgeted for the Board in FY 2016. KRGC has also requested additional funding to implement the Gaming Machine Examination Fund required by K.S.A. 74-8750(c) for the certification of electronic gaming equipment. For FY 2016 \$1.38 million in contractual services are budgeted for the administration of testing and certification of electronic gaming equipment. The final enhancement package requested by KRGC for FY 2016 is for the anticipated opening of a gaming facility in the southeast gaming zone. KRGC has assumed the gaming facility may commence operations in June of 2016 and has budgeted approximately \$80,000 in contractual services related to a gaming facility in the southeast gaming zone for FY 2016.

**Budget Year - Base Budget FY 2017**

The FY 2017 budget year reflects costs for the ongoing expanded gaming regulation of the three operational lottery gaming facilities, and an operational gaming facility in the southeast gaming zone.

NOTE: The KRGC requests to continue the Hospitality Fund in the amount of \$1,500 for purpose of hosting public meetings.

**Enhancement**

There are two enhancement requests for FY 2017. KRGC has requested additional funding to implement the Gaming Machine Examination Fund required by K.S.A. 74-8750(c) for the certification of electronic gaming equipment. For FY 2017 \$1.38 million in contractual services are budgeted for the testing and certification of electronic gaming equipment. The final enhancement requested by KRGC for FY 2017 is for the anticipated operation of a gaming facility in the southeast gaming zone. KRGC has budgeted approximately \$70,000 of contractual services for regulatory costs related to a gaming facility in the southeast gaming zone in FY 2017.

**Prior Year - FY 2014**

The FY 2014 reflects costs associated with the regulation of expanded gaming for the Topeka office, the Boot Hill Casino in Ford county, Hollywood Casino in Wyandotte county, and Kansas Star Casino in Sumner county. Major categories of supplies include materials for repair of office equipment; supplies and materials for repair and maintenance of state vehicles (e.g. oil changes, tires) and fuel charges for state vehicles; professional and scientific supplies for law enforcement materials (e.g. hand guns, ammunition, EGM testing supplies), legal directories and security tags for gaming machines; office supplies for the Topeka, Boot Hill Casino, Kansas Star Casino, and Hollywood Casino KRGC offices. Office supplies include security badge supplies for the printing and replacement of security badges for gaming facility employees.

**Current Year - FY 2015**

The FY 2015 costs include the regulation of expanded gaming for all three lottery gaming facilities as described above for FY 2014.

**Enhancement**

There is a single enhancement package for FY 2015 related to commodities. KRGC has requested additional funding to reconvene the Board as required by the passage of House Bill 2272 in the 2014 legislative session. Approximately, \$7,000 of additional commodity expenses are budgeted for the Board in FY 2015.

**Budget Year - Base Budget FY 2016**

The FY 2016 base budget reflects costs associated with the regulation of expanded gaming for the Topeka, the Boot Hill Casino, the Hollywood Casino and the Kansas Star Casino KRGC offices for an entire year and the regulatory costs associated with the commencement of gaming at a gaming facility in the southeast gaming zone. KRGC anticipates that the casino in the southeast gaming zone may open in June of 2016. KRGC expects to incur operational costs related to the operation of a gaming facility in the southeast gaming zone in January of 2016.

**Enhancement**

KRGC requests an enhancement of approximately \$24,000 for commodities associated with the possible opening of a gaming facility in the southeast gaming zone.

**Budget Year - Base Budget FY 2017**

For the FY 2017 base budget reflects costs associated with the regulation of expanded gaming for the Topeka, the Boot Hill Casino, the Hollywood Casino, and the Kansas Star Casino KRGC offices and an operational lottery gaming facility in the southeast gaming zone for an entire year.

KRGC requests an enhancement of approximately \$17,000 for commodities associated with the possible operation of a gaming facility in the southeast gaming zone in FY 2017.

**Prior Year - FY2014**

The FY 2014 expenses for capital outlay include replacement of older computer workstations and related software and an update of windows operating system software. Capital outlay purchases also included the renewal of licensing software.

**Current Year - FY 2015**

The current FY 2015 reflects capital outlays associated with the regulation of expanded gaming for the Topeka office and KRGC offices located at each of the three operating lottery gaming facilities. Expenditures include gaming test equipment; scheduled printer replacements; scheduled server replacements and other miscellaneous hardware. KRGC has also requested additional funding to implement the Gaming Machine Examination Fund as required by K.S.A. 74-8750(c) for the certification of electronic gaming equipment. For FY 2015 an additional \$192,000 is requested for capital outlay related to the certification of electronic gaming equipment.

**Budget Year - Base Budget FY 2016**

The FY 2016 budget year reflects continued costs associated with the regulation of gaming for the Topeka office and the KRGC offices located at each of the three lottery gaming facilities. Expenditures include scheduled replacement computer workstations; scheduled server replacement; gaming test equipment; and other miscellaneous hardware. In addition, KRGC anticipates additional capital outlay expenditures related to the possible opening of a new gaming facility in the southeast gaming zone.

**Enhancement**

KRGC has requested additional capital outlay funds for FY 2016 based on the assumption that a gaming facility in the southeast gaming zone may begin operating in June of 2016. KRGC may begin expending funds for the southeast gaming zone in January of 2016 as employees are hired and trained prior to the opening of a gaming facility. KRGC estimates approximately \$84,000 of additional capital outlay will be necessary for the southeast gaming zone in FY 2016.

**Budget Year - Base Budget FY 2017**

The FY 2017 budget year reflects continued costs associated with the regulation of gaming for the Topeka office and the KRGC offices located at each of the three lottery gaming facilities. Expenditures include scheduled replacement computer workstations; scheduled replacement servers; gaming test equipment; and other miscellaneous hardware. In addition, KRGC anticipates additional capital outlay expenditures related to the operation of a new gaming facility in the southeast gaming zone.

**Enhancement**

KRGC has requested additional capital outlay funds for FY 2017 related based on the assumption that a gaming facility in the southeast gaming zone may be operating in FY 2017.
