**ISSUE SUMMARY:** Pursuant to K.A.R. 112-114-1 *et seq.*, the KRGC Disciplinary Review Board considered potential gaming regulation violations by licensee Torrance Dwayne Stegman and facility manager Kansas Star Casino, LLC. The licensee, Torrance Stegman, and facility manager, Kansas Star Casino, LLC, stipulated to the Summary Proceeding Orders' Findings of Fact and waived the right to a hearing. A brief summary of the Findings of Fact follows:

### 2016-2003 Torrance Stegman

On June 11, 2016, Torrance Stegman (a slot technician) failed to transfer the progressive jackpots on two progressive electronic gaming machines (EGMs) before RAM clearing those EGMs, which permanently deleted the entire memory of the machines. Mr. Stegman also failed to complete the required EGM Information Form before RAM clearing the EGMs. Mr. Stegman stipulated to these facts and waived his right to a hearing. See attached Summary Proceeding Order and Hearing Waiver.

### 2016-2004 Kansas Star Casino, LLC

On June 11, 2016, Kansas Star Casino, LLC (a facility manager) failed to transfer the progressive jackpots on two progressive EGMs, failed to complete the required EGM Information Form, and failed to otherwise record the required information before those EGMs were RAM cleared. Kansas Star Casino, LLC was ordered to transfer the progressive jackpots and has since provided documentation that the jackpots were transferred on a later date. Additionally, Kansas Star Casino, LLC was ordered to amend its internal controls to clarify for each slot form: which form is required, who is required to prepare the form, and when the form is required. Kansas Star Casino, LLC stipulated to these facts and waived the right to a hearing. See attached Summary Proceeding Order and Hearing Waiver.

**COMMISSION ACTION REQUIRED/REQUESTED:** Accept the Respondents' hearing waivers and uphold the Disciplinary Review Board's Summary Proceeding Orders.

**STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:** Staff recommends the Commission accept the hearing waivers filed by Torrance Stegman and Kansas Star Casino, LLC and uphold the Disciplinary Review Board's Summary Proceeding Orders issued in KRGC Case No. 2016-2002 and 2016-2003.

**SUMMARY PROCEEDING ORDER AND  
NOTICE OF HEARING AND RIGHT TO WAIVE**

The Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission (KRGC), through its Disciplinary Review Board (DRB), hereby gives notice that Torrance Dwayne Stegman (Respondent), a slot technician, has violated KRGC regulation K.A.R. 112-104-41(b)(22), 112-107-21(g)(4), 112-113-1(a)(5); Kansas Star Casino Internal Controls Slots Section 4.G., Slots Section 6.L.4.c.; and the Kansas Star Casino Slot Technician Job Description Slots Section 2 by failing to complete an EGM Information Form and transfer patron contributions from two progressive EGMs before RAM clearing those EGMs:

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. On June 11, 2016, Respondent was on duty as a slot technician at Kansas Star Casino.
2. At approximately 8:15 am, Respondent began a project which included converting two progressive electronic gaming machines (EGMs), seats 1 and 2 from Bank 252, from "A Christmas Story" to "Batgirl and Catwoman."
3. As part of the project, Respondent RAM cleared both progressive EGMs before installing the new "Batgirl and Catwoman" games. When Respondent RAM cleared the EGMs, he deleted the entire memory from both EGMs which included patron contributions and the accumulated credits on the progressive meter.

4. Before Respondent RAM cleared the EGMs, Respondent did not complete an EGM Information Form. Respondent did not document the date and time of the RAM clear, the EGM number, the location, and the number of credits played before the RAM clearing occurred, the current video displays, the previous two video displays, the actual meter readings of the internal hard and soft meters, the reason for the RAM clear, or sign his name as the slot technician who performed the RAM clear.
5. When asked to provide a statement about the incident, Respondent wrote: “So Saturday morning, I came in, installed the software and RAM Cleared [sic] the games, loosing [sic] the progressives and didn’t verify first that all appropriate paperwork had been filled out.”
6. After discovering the progressive meters had not been transferred, a KRGC agent asked the Kansas Lottery to provide an estimate of the progressive EGM jackpots that should have been transferred. The Kansas Lottery estimated for Seat 1 that \$108.10 should have been added to the Level 1 jackpot and that \$19.23 should have been added to the Level 2 jackpot. The Kansas Lottery estimated for Seat 2 that \$252.66 should have been added to the Level 1 jackpot and \$17.22 should have been added to the Level 2 jackpot. In total, approximately \$397.21 should have been added to the progressive EGM jackpots.
7. KRGC regulation K.A.R. 112-107-21(g)(4) states that: “any facility manager may transfer a progressive jackpot amount on a stand-alone LFG [lottery facility game]. . . . To be eligible for transfer, the progressive jackpot shall meet the following conditions: (A) Be transferred in its entirety; and (B) be transferred to .

. . (i) the progressive meter for an LFG . . . with the same or greater probability of winning the progressive jackpot, the same or lower wager requirement to be eligible to win the progressive jackpot, and the same type of progressive jackpot. . . .”

8. Pursuant to KRGC regulation K.A.R. 112-107-21(g)(4), Kansas Star Casino implemented Internal Control Slots Section 6 L.4.c. which requires that: “. . . [p]rogressive funds must be transferred in their entirety and be transferred to one or more progressive meters for an EGM . . . with the same or greater probability of winning the jackpot, the same or lower wager requirement, and the same progressive jackpot. . . .”
9. KRGC regulation K.A.R. 112-104-41(b) states that: “the following forms shall be a part of each facility manager’s minimum internal controls: . . . (22) a RAM clearing slip, including the following details:
  - (A) The date and time that the RAM was cleared;
  - (B) an EGM number, the location, and the number of credits played before the RAM clearing occurred;
  - (C) the current reel positions or video displays;
  - (D) the previous two reel positions or video displays;
  - (E) the actual meter readings of the internal hard and soft meters;
  - (F) the progressive jackpot display, if linked;
  - (G) the reason for RAM clear; and
  - (H) all required signatures. . . .”
10. Pursuant to KRGC regulation K.A.R. 112-104-41(b)(22), Kansas Star Casino

implemented Internal Controls Slots Section 4.G. which states: “EGM Information Form (Manually Prepared) . . . A form used to document machine meter readings prior to a RAM clear. The RAM Clear Checklist will be retained by the Slot Department and will include the following information: date and time of RAM clear, EGM number, the location, and the number of credits played before the RAM clearing occurred, current reel positions or video displays, previous two reel positions or video displays, actual meter readings of the internal hard and soft meters, progressive jackpot display, if linked, reason for RAM clear, and signature of the Slot Technician or above.”

11. KRGC regulation K.A.R. 112-113-1(a) states that “any licensee may be sanctioned for . . . (5) failing to follow the . . . facility manager’s minimum internal control system. . . .”
12. The Kansas Star Casino Slot Technician Job Description, as part of Kansas Star Casino’s Internal Controls Slot Section 2, requires that slot technicians “[m]aintain records as needed.”

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

13. Respondent violated KRGC regulations K.A.R. 112-104-41(b)(22), 112-113-1(a)(5), and Kansas Star Casino Internal Control Slots Section 4.G. when Respondent failed to fill out the required EGM Information Form before RAM clearing the two progressive EGMs. Because Respondent failed to complete the EGM Information Form, Kansas Star Casino does not have a document recording the date and time of the RAM clear, the EGM number, the location, the number of credits played on the EGMs before the RAM clearing occurred, the current video

displays, the previous two video displays, the actual meter readings of the internal hard and soft meters, the reason for the RAM clear, or the signature of the Respondent as the slot technician who performed the RAM clear. Because Respondent was the assigned slot technician to RAM clear the EGMs, Respondent had the duty to document all of this information and failed to do so.

14. By failing to complete the EGM Information Form, Respondent also violated the Kansas Star Casino Slot Technician Job Description Slots Section 2 because Respondent did not maintain records as needed.
15. Because Respondent failed to complete an EGM Information Form as required by KRGC regulation K.A.R. 112-104-41(b)(22) and Kansas Star Casino Internal Control Slots Section 4.G., Respondent was unable to transfer the patron contributions from those EGMs and therefore violated KRGC regulation K.A.R. 112-107-21(g)(4) and Kansas Star Casino Control Slots Section 6 L.4.c. Respondent did not transfer the progressive funds in their entirety and failed to transfer approximately \$397.21 which should have been added to the progressive jackpots.

#### STATEMENT OF POLICY

Under the Kansas Expanded Lottery Act, the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission is required to oversee the enforcement of state laws, enforcement of internal controls, and the credentialing of employees at Kansas lottery gaming facilities. The Kansas Expanded Lottery Act directed the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission to adopt rules and regulations to oversee all lottery gaming facility operations. Pursuant to this mandate, the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission created regulations that subject a licensee to sanctions, including license

suspension or revocation, when the licensee violates any provision of the Kansas Expanded Lottery Act (KELA), KRGC regulations, or a facility manager's internal controls.

By requiring licensees to adhere to KRGC regulations and the facility manager's internal controls, the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission ensures the integrity of gaming in Kansas. Regulations and internal controls regarding procedures for converting electronic gaming machines ensure each electronic gaming machine complies with all regulatory requirements when patrons play those machines. When a licensee fails to transfer patron contributions from progressive EGMs, patrons' bets are not counted toward the progressive EGMs' jackpots which directly compromises the integrity of that game. Enforcement of these provisions is necessary to ensure the integrity of gaming in the state of Kansas and protect the public interest.

#### SANCTION

16. In accordance with K.A.R. 112-113-1(c), the DRB may consider certain factors in considering appropriate sanctions, including risk to the public and to the integrity of gaming operations created by the conduct of the licensee; the nature of the violation; culpability of the licensee; any justification or excuse for the conduct; the licensee's history with respect to compliance; and corrective action taken by the licensee. Moreover, K.A.R. 112-113-1(e) states "it shall be no absolute defense that the licensee . . . inadvertently, unintentionally, or unknowingly" committed a regulatory violation and "shall affect only the degree of the sanction to be imposed. . . ."
17. The DRB considers the following factors:
  - a. Respondent's actions compromised the integrity of gaming in Kansas.  
Patrons play progressive EGMs with the expectation that every bet placed

increases the jackpot amount that can be won. Because of the Respondent, patrons' bets on the two progressive EGMs were functionally not counted which lowered the jackpot amounts that patrons could win on those machines. By failing to transfer the progressive jackpots, Respondent directly compromised the integrity of those two progressive EGMs.

- b. There is no justification or excuse for the conduct. As the Slot Technician assigned to RAM clear the EGMs, the Respondent had the duty to manually fill out an EGM Information Form. Had the Respondent completed this form, Respondent would have been able to easily transfer the progressive jackpots as required.
- c. Respondent took no corrective action. Even after RAM clearing the EGMs, Respondent could have partially completed the EGM Information Form with as much information as possible but he failed to do so. Because of the Respondent, Kansas Star Casino has no EGM Information Form for the conversion of these two progressive EGMs.
- d. The DRB has not previously issued a formal sanction to the Respondent. However, because the Respondent has been employed at Kansas Star Casino as a Slot Technician for over two years and his actions directly compromised the integrity of gaming in Kansas, the DRB considers the ordered sanction appropriate.

18. Based on the above-described findings of fact, conclusions of law, statement of policy, and sanction factors the DRB orders the Respondent to serve a two-day unpaid suspension. The two-day suspension shall total 16 hours. The dates of the

two-day unpaid suspension shall be determined by the KRGC supervising enforcement agent for the gaming facility where Respondent is employed.


19. Respondent is entitled to a hearing on the above matter, which Respondent may waive by signing and returning the enclosed Hearing Waiver to the KRGC by mail, email, or fax. (See Notice of Hearing and Right to Waive below.)
20. If Respondent waives the right to a hearing, the two-day unpaid suspension must be served within 30 days of this Order becoming final and effective. Once the suspension is served, Respondent must also send a timesheet showing the suspension occurred to the KRGC by mail, email, or fax to the address listed below within 30 days of this Order becoming final and effective.
21. If Respondent does not serve the ordered two-day unpaid suspension or does not send a timesheet showing the suspension occurred within 30 days of this Order becoming final and effective, Respondent's license will be automatically indefinitely suspended at the end of the business day without further notification or action taken by the Commission until all terms of this Order are fulfilled and the Respondent's license is reinstated by the KRGC.
22. This Order shall become part of Respondent's permanent KRGC licensing file.

#### ORDER

In accordance with the above-described findings of fact, conclusions of law, statement of policy, and sanction factors,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission suspend Respondent's license for two days.

## NOTICE OF HEARING AND RIGHT TO WAIVE

Respondent is entitled to a hearing on the above matter. This right to a hearing may be waived at Respondent's option. (See instructions below for Waiving Right to a Hearing.)

### Hearing - Presentation of Written Evidence:

Unless Respondent waives the right to a hearing, this matter will be presented to the Commission on Friday, October 14, 2016 at 10:00 a.m., at the Eisenhower State Office Building, 700 SW Harrison, Suite 410, Topeka, KS 66603. Respondent may request to appear by phone. To appear by phone, Respondent must send a written request (by mail, email, or fax) to the address below no later than October 7, 2016. Once the request to appear by phone is received, Respondent will receive instructions on how to call into the hearing.

Written evidence will be presented along with brief oral arguments by the agency and Respondent. Neither party will present live witness testimony at this time. Respondent has the right to be represented by counsel at the Respondent's expense.

If Respondent does not appear at the hearing in person or by phone, a decision will be made on the evidence presented, and any decision will become final agency action. If Respondent has written evidence to present to the Commission, copies of all relevant written evidence must be sent (by mail, email, or fax) no later than September 30, 2016 to the address below.

Following arguments, the Commission will consider the arguments and evidence presented, and if the Commission determines no further evidence is necessary for a finding, the Commission will issue its Order. The Commission can uphold, overturn, or amend the Disciplinary Review Board's Summary Order. If the Commission determines further evidence is necessary for a finding, the case will be continued to the next commission meeting to allow for a full evidentiary hearing. If the Commission issues an Order without a full evidentiary hearing, the Respondent has an automatic right to a full evidentiary hearing where witness testimony will be taken. The right to a full evidentiary hearing may be waived by Respondent prior to the scheduled hearing (see Waiving Right to a Hearing below).

### Full Evidentiary Hearing – Presentation of Witness Testimony:

The full evidentiary hearing with witnesses, if required, will be held at the regularly scheduled Commission meeting on November 18, 2016 at 10:00 a.m. at the Eisenhower State Office Building, 700 SW Harrison, Topeka, KS 66603. (Date and location subject to change).

At this hearing, Respondent has the right to produce additional evidence and witnesses on the Respondent's behalf, the right to cross-examine any witness who may testify against the Respondent, and the right to examine any evidence that may be produced against the Respondent. Respondent may request to appear by phone. To appear by phone, Respondent must send a written request (by mail, email, or fax) to the address below no later than November 10, 2016.

The Commission will issue a final Order either directly after deliberation or within 30 days of the hearing date. This Order will constitute final agency action and is subject to appeal under the Kansas Judicial Review Act. If Respondent does not appear at the hearing in person or by phone, a decision will be made on the evidence presented, and any decision will become final agency action subject to appeal under the Kansas Judicial Review Act. 

SUMMARY PROCEEDING ORDER AND  
NOTICE OF HEARING AND RIGHT TO WAIVE

The Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission (KRGC), through its Disciplinary Review Board (DRB), hereby gives notice that Kansas Star Casino, LLC (Respondent), a lottery gaming facility manager, has violated KRGC regulations K.A.R. 112-104-41(b)(22), 112-107-21(g)(4), 112-107-21(i), 112-113-1(a)(5); and Kansas Star Casino Internal Controls Slots Section 4.G., Slots Section 6.L.4.c. by failing to properly document and transfer progressive jackpot amounts from two progressive EGMs after those EGMs were RAM cleared:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent is certified by the KRGC as a lottery gaming facility manager.
2. The Findings of Fact from the Summary Proceeding Order and Notice of Hearing and Right to Waive (Summary Order) issued to Torrance Dwayne Stegman in KRGC Case No. 2016-2002 are incorporated herein by reference. (See attachment).
3. KRGC regulation K.A.R. 112-104-41(b) states that: “the following forms shall be a part of each facility manager’s minimum internal controls: . . . (22) a RAM clearing slip, including the following details:
  - (A) The date and time that the RAM was cleared;
  - (B) an EGM number, the location, and the number of credits played before the

RAM clearing occurred;

- (C) the current reel positions or video displays;
- (D) the previous two reel positions or video displays;
- (E) the actual meter readings of the internal hard and soft meters;
- (F) the progressive jackpot display, if linked;
- (G) the reason for RAM clear; and
- (H) all required signatures. . . .”

4. Pursuant to KRGC regulation K.A.R. 112-104-41(b)(22), Respondent implemented Kansas Star Casino Internal Control Slots Section 4.G. which states: “EGM Information Form (Manually Prepared) . . . . A form used to document machine meter readings prior to a RAM clear. The RAM Clear Checklist will be retained by the Slot Department and will include the following information: date and time of RAM clear, EGM number, the location, and the number of credits played before the RAM clearing occurred, current reel positions or video displays, previous two reel positions or video displays, actual meter readings of the internal hard and soft meters, progressive jackpot display, if linked, reason for RAM clear, and signature of the Slot Technician or above.”
5. KRGC regulation K.A.R. 112-107-21(g)(4) states that: “any facility manager may transfer a progressive jackpot amount on a stand-alone LFG [lottery facility game] . . . . To be eligible for transfer, the progressive jackpot shall meet the following conditions: (A) Be transferred in its entirety; and (B) be transferred to . . . (i) the progressive meter for an LFG . . . with the same or greater probability of winning the progressive jackpot, the same or lower wager requirement to be

eligible to win the progressive jackpot, and the same type of progressive jackpot. . . .”

6. KRGC regulation K.A.R. 112-107-21(i) requires that: “. . . each LFG offering a progressive jackpot that is removed from the gaming floor shall be returned or replaced on the gaming floor within five gaming days. The amount on the progressive meter or meters on the returned or replacement LFG shall not be less than the amount on the progressive meter or meters at the time of removal. If an LFG offering a progressive jackpot is not returned or replaced, any progressive meter amount at the time of removal shall, within five days of the LFG’s removal, be added to an LFG offering a progressive jackpot approved by the executive director. . . .”
7. Pursuant to KRGC regulation K.A.R. 112-107-21(g)(4) and K.A.R. 112-107-21(i), Respondent implemented Kansas Star Casino Internal Control Slots Section 6 L.4. which requires that: “. . . Progressive jackpot displays will not be turned back unless one of the following circumstances occurs: . . . c. The progressive jackpot has been transferred to another progressive EGM. . . . Progressive funds must be transferred in their entirety and be transferred to one or more progressive meters for an EGM . . . with the same or greater probability of winning the jackpot, the same or lower wager requirement, and the same progressive jackpot. . . . *any progressive amount transferred from one machine to another, must be completed within 5 days of removal of the game(s) from which funds are being transferred.*” (Emphasis added.)
8. KRGC regulation K.A.R. 112-113-1(a) states that “any . . . certificate holder . . .

may be sanctioned for violating any provision of the act, these regulations, or any other law that directly or indirectly affects the integrity of gaming in Kansas, including a violation of any of the following: . . . (5) failing to follow the commission's minimum internal control standards or the facility manager's minimum internal control system. . . .”

9. On June 11, 2016, at approximately 8:15 am, one of Respondent's slot technicians, Torrance Stegman, began a project to convert two progressive electronic gaming machines (EGMs), Seats 1 and 2 of Bank 252, from “A Christmas Story” to “Batgirl and Catwoman.”
10. To convert the progressive EGMs, Mr. Stegman had to RAM clear the EGMs before installing the new “Batgirl and Catwoman” games. When Mr. Stegman RAM cleared the EGMs, he deleted the entire memory from both EGMs which included the progressive jackpot amounts.
11. Before Mr. Stegman RAM cleared those EGMs, he did not prepare an EGM Information Form and none of Respondent's employees otherwise documented the information required by the EGM Information Form, which included the progressive jackpot amounts.
12. When asked about the incident, Mr. Stegman told the KRGC agent that the procedure for documenting meters is usually performed by the slot technicians who power the machines down. In his written statement, Mr. Stegman stated he had assumed the “Grave Shift had already done the closeout paperwork along with writing the meters down on the appropriate sheets, since they [the EGMs] were already powered down. . . . So Saturday morning, I came in, installed the

software and RAM Cleared [sic] the games, loosing [sic] the progressives and didn't verify first that all appropriate paperwork had been filled out."

13. After discovering the progressive jackpot amounts had not been documented or transferred, a KRGC agent asked the Kansas Lottery to provide an estimate of the progressive jackpot amounts that should have been transferred. The Kansas Lottery estimated for Seat 1 that \$108.10 should have been added to the Level 1 jackpot and that \$19.23 should have been added to the Level 2 jackpot. The Kansas Lottery estimated for Seat 2 that \$252.66 should have been added to the Level 1 jackpot and \$17.22 should have been added to the Level 2 jackpot. In total, approximately \$397.21 should have been added to the progressive EGM jackpots. (See attached Kansas Lottery estimate.)

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

14. The Conclusions of Law from the above-referenced Summary Order are incorporated herein by reference. (See attachment.)
15. Respondent and all of its employee-licensees are required by K.A.R. 112-100-4 to know and comply with the Kansas Expanded Lottery Act (KELA) as well as KRGC regulations *relating to the certificate or license held*. Thus, Respondent, as a lottery gaming facility manager certificate holder, must know and comply with KELA provisions that pertain to lottery gaming facilities (but not racetrack gaming facilities), as well as all articles of KRGC administrative regulations that relate to lottery gaming facilities (i.e., K.A.R. 112-100-1, *et seq.*). Respondent's key gaming employees, which include all Level I licensees, must likewise know these same KELA and regulatory provisions because they are Respondent's

managers, supervisors, policy makers, and discretionary decision makers (see K.A.R. 112-103-2(a)). Level II and III licensees are required to know and comply with KELA provisions and KRGC regulations that relate to their specific jobs (e.g., a slot technician must know and comply with Article 107 – Electronic gaming machine requirements, as well as generally applicable regulations such as Article 100 – General Provisions and Definitions; Article 103 – Employee Licensing; electronic gaming machine related provisions within Article 104 – Minimum Internal Control System; Article 112 – Responsible Gambling; Article 113 – Sanctions; Article 114 – Hearings; and other articles or portions thereof which relate to the duties of a slot technician or to a licensee generally.)

16. K.A.R. 112-113-1(a)(5) provides that the Respondent (as a lottery gaming facility manager certificate holder) and its employees (as licensees) can be sanctioned for violating the facility manager's internal controls. A facility manager's internal controls set forth Respondent's administrative, accounting, and operational processes, procedures, rules, duties, and responsibilities that employees must follow to comply with the requirements of KELA, KRGC regulations, and the facility manager's contract with the state of Kansas. These internal controls are designed to provide effective and particularized rules to ensure the integrity of the operation of lottery facility games at each lottery gaming facility.
17. K.A.R. 112-104-41(b)(22) and Kansas Star Casino Internal Control Slots Section 4.G. require a specific form, the EGM Information Form, to be manually prepared by the slot technician who RAM clears the EGMs before the RAM clearing occurs. This required form exists so that certain information, including the

progressive jackpot amounts, is guaranteed to be documented. None of the Respondent's slot employees completed an EGM Information Form or otherwise recorded any of the required information listed in K.A.R. 112-104-41(b)(22) and Kansas Star Casino Internal Control Slots Section 4.G. before Seats 1 and 2 of Bank 252 were RAM cleared, thereby violating KRGC regulations and Kansas Star Casino internal controls.

18. Further, the slot technician who RAM cleared the EGMs (Mr. Stegman) stated that the slot technician who powers down the EGMs normally records that information even though KRGC regulations and Kansas Star Casino internal controls require the slot technician who RAM clears the EGM to manually prepare the EGM Information Form. If Mr. Stegman is correct that slot technicians who do not RAM clear the EGMs regularly prepare EGM Information Forms, then KRGC regulations and Kansas Star Casino internal controls are being violated on a reoccurring basis. If Mr. Stegman is incorrect and slot technicians who do not RAM clear the EGMs are not preparing the EGM Information Forms, then Respondent has failed to properly train Mr. Stegman on the procedures for RAM clearing and converting a progressive EGM. In either scenario, Respondent as the facility manager has failed to ensure its employees know and comply with KRGC regulations and Kansas Star Casino internal controls.
19. K.A.R. 112-107-21(g)(4) and Kansas Star Casino Internal Control Slots Section 6 L.4.c. require that progressive funds must be transferred in their entirety when progressive EGMs are converted. In this case, because Respondent failed to document the progressive jackpot amounts before the "A Christmas Story" EGMs

were RAM cleared, Respondent also failed to transfer the progressive funds in their entirety to the new “Batgirl and Catwoman” games in violation of KRGC regulations and Kansas Star Casino internal controls.

20. K.A.R. 112-107-21(i) requires that any lottery facility game with a progressive jackpot that is removed from the gaming floor must be returned or replaced within five gaming days with the same or greater progressive jackpot amount. Kansas Star Casino Internal Controls Slots Section 6.L.4.c specifically requires that any progressive jackpot amount that is transferred from one EGM to another must be completed within 5 days. When Respondent’s slot technician RAM cleared the EGMs, he permanently deleted the entire memory of both games thereby removing the games from the gaming floor. As the facility manager, Respondent then had a duty to ensure that the progressive jackpot amounts were transferred in their entirety within five days. As of this date, Respondent has yet to transfer the progressive jackpot amounts totaling approximately \$397.21 that were deleted from Seats 1 and 2 of Bank 252 on June 11, 2016 in violation of KRGC regulations and Kansas Star Casino Internal Controls.

Under the Kansas Expanded Lottery Act, the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission is required to oversee the enforcement of state laws, enforcement of internal controls, and the credentialing of employees at Kansas lottery gaming facilities. The Kansas Expanded Lottery Act directed the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission to adopt rules and regulations to oversee all lottery gaming facility operations. Pursuant to this mandate, the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission created regulations that subject a lottery gaming facility to sanctions when

the lottery gaming facility's employees violate any provision of KRGC regulations or the facility manager's internal controls.

By requiring lottery gaming facilities to adhere to KRGC regulations and the facility manager's internal controls the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission ensures the integrity of gaming in Kansas. Regulations and internal controls regarding procedures for converting and removing EGMs ensure each EGM complies with all regulatory requirements when patrons play those machines. When a lottery gaming facility's slot personnel fail to document and transfer progressive jackpot amounts when converting EGMs, patrons' bets are not counted toward the progressive jackpots which directly compromises the integrity of those EGMs. Enforcement of these provisions is necessary to ensure the integrity of gaming in the state of Kansas and protect the public interest.

#### SANCTION

21. In accordance with K.A.R. 112-113-1(c), the DRB may consider certain factors in considering appropriate sanctions, including risk to the public and to the integrity of gaming operations created by the conduct of the certificate holder; the nature of the violation; culpability of the certificate holder; any justification or excuse for the conduct; the certificate holder's history with respect to compliance; and any corrective action taken. Moreover, K.A.R. 112-113-1(e) states "it shall be no absolute defense that the licensee [or] certificate holder . . . inadvertently, unintentionally, or unknowingly" committed a regulatory violation and "shall affect only the degree of the sanction to be imposed. . . ."
22. The DRB considers the following factors:
  - a. Respondent's actions compromised the integrity of gaming in Kansas and

violated the public's trust. Patrons play progressive EGMs with the expectation that every bet placed increases the jackpot amount that can be won. Because of the Respondent, patrons' bets on the two progressive EGMs were functionally not counted which lowered the jackpot amounts that patrons could win on those machines. By failing to transfer the progressive jackpots, Respondent directly compromised the integrity of gaming in Kansas.

- b. There is no justification or excuse for the conduct.
- c. Respondent took no corrective action. Respondent could have attempted to determine the progressive jackpot amounts and transferred those jackpot amounts to the new EGMs but failed to do so.
- d. Because Respondent has not previously committed a regulatory violation of this nature, the DRB is not ordering a more stringent sanction. Should Respondent fail to properly document or transfer progressive jackpot amounts in the future, the DRB will issue a more stringent sanction.

23. Based on the above-described findings of fact, conclusions of law, statement of policy, and sanction factors the DRB orders the Respondent to increase the progressive jackpots on Seats 1 and 2 of Bank 252 by the following amounts:

- a. Seat 1:
  - i. Level 1 jackpot: \$252.66
  - ii. Level 2 jackpot: \$17.22
- b. Seat 2:
  - i. Level 1 jackpot: \$108.10

- ii. Level 2 jackpot: \$19,23
24. The DRB further orders the Respondent to amend the Kansas Star Casino internal controls to clarify the following for each slot form:
- a. Which form is required for which process;
  - b. Who is required to prepare the form; and
  - c. When the form is required to be prepared.
25. The amended internal controls shall be submitted to the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission's Audit Division for approval. A copy of the amended internal controls shall also be sent to the following address by mail, email, or fax:

26. Respondent is entitled to a hearing on the above matter, which Respondent may waive by signing and returning the enclosed Hearing Waiver to the KRGC by mail, email, or fax. (See Notice of Hearing and Right to Waive below.)
27. If Respondent waives the right to a hearing, the terms of this Order must be fulfilled within 30 days of this Order becoming final and effective.
28. If Respondent does not comply with the terms of this Order within 30 days of this Order becoming final and effective, Respondent's certificate will be automatically indefinitely suspended at the end of the business day without further notification or action taken by the Commission until all terms of this Order are fulfilled and the Respondent's certificate is reinstated by the KRGC.
29. This Order shall become part of the Respondent's permanent KRGC licensing



SUMMARY PROCEEDING ORDER AND  
NOTICE OF HEARING AND RIGHT TO WAIVE

The Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission (KRGC), through its Disciplinary Review Board (DRB), hereby gives notice that Torrance Dwayne Stegman (Respondent), a slot technician, has violated KRGC regulation K.A.R. 112-104-41(b)(22), 112-107-21(g)(4), 112-113-1(a)(5); Kansas Star Casino Internal Controls Slots Section 4.G., Slots Section 6.L.4.c.; and the Kansas Star Casino Slot Technician Job Description Slots Section 2 by failing to complete an EGM Information Form and transfer patron contributions from two progressive EGMs before RAM clearing those EGMs:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On June 11, 2016, Respondent was on duty as a slot technician at Kansas Star Casino.
2. At approximately 8:15 am, Respondent began a project which included converting two progressive electronic gaming machines (EGMs), seats 1 and 2 from Bank 252, from "A Christmas Story" to "Batgirl and Catwoman."
3. As part of the project, Respondent RAM cleared both progressive EGMs before installing the new "Batgirl and Catwoman" games. When Respondent RAM cleared the EGMs, he deleted the entire memory from both EGMs which included patron contributions and the accumulated credits on the progressive meter.

4. Before Respondent RAM cleared the EGMs, Respondent did not complete an EGM Information Form. Respondent did not document the date and time of the RAM clear, the EGM number, the location, and the number of credits played before the RAM clearing occurred, the current video displays, the previous two video displays, the actual meter readings of the internal hard and soft meters, the reason for the RAM clear, or sign his name as the slot technician who performed the RAM clear.
5. When asked to provide a statement about the incident, Respondent wrote: "So Saturday morning, I came in, installed the software and RAM Cleared [sic] the games, loosing [sic] the progressives and didn't verify first that all appropriate paperwork had been filled out."
6. After discovering the progressive meters had not been transferred, a KRGC agent asked the Kansas Lottery to provide an estimate of the progressive EGM jackpots that should have been transferred. The Kansas Lottery estimated for Seat 1 that \$108.10 should have been added to the Level 1 jackpot and that \$19.23 should have been added to the Level 2 jackpot. The Kansas Lottery estimated for Seat 2 that \$252.66 should have been added to the Level 1 jackpot and \$17.22 should have been added to the Level 2 jackpot. In total, approximately \$397.21 should have been added to the progressive EGM jackpots.
7. KRGC regulation K.A.R. 112-107-21(g)(4) states that: "any facility manager may transfer a progressive jackpot amount on a stand-alone LFG [lottery facility game]. . . . To be eligible for transfer, the progressive jackpot shall meet the following conditions: (A) Be transferred in its entirety; and (B) be transferred to .

. . (i) the progressive meter for an LFG . . . with the same or greater probability of winning the progressive jackpot, the same or lower wager requirement to be eligible to win the progressive jackpot, and the same type of progressive jackpot. . . .”

8. Pursuant to KRGC regulation K.A.R. 112-107-21(g)(4), Kansas Star Casino implemented Internal Control Slots Section 6 L.4.c. which requires that: “. . . [p]rogressive funds must be transferred in their entirety and be transferred to one or more progressive meters for an EGM . . . with the same or greater probability of winning the jackpot, the same or lower wager requirement, and the same progressive jackpot. . . .”
9. KRGC regulation K.A.R. 112-104-41(b) states that: “the following forms shall be a part of each facility manager’s minimum internal controls; . . . (22) a RAM clearing slip, including the following details:
  - (A) The date and time that the RAM was cleared;
  - (B) an EGM number, the location, and the number of credits played before the RAM clearing occurred;
  - (C) the current reel positions or video displays;
  - (D) the previous two reel positions or video displays;
  - (E) the actual meter readings of the internal hard and soft meters;
  - (F) the progressive jackpot display, if linked;
  - (G) the reason for RAM clear; and
  - (H) all required signatures. . . .”
10. Pursuant to KRGC regulation K.A.R. 112-104-41(b)(22), Kansas Star Casino

implemented Internal Controls Slots Section 4.G, which states: "EGM Information Form (Manually Prepared) . . . . A form used to document machine meter readings prior to a RAM clear. The RAM Clear Checklist will be retained by the Slot Department and will include the following information: date and time of RAM clear, EGM number, the location, and the number of credits played before the RAM clearing occurred, current reel positions or video displays, previous two reel positions or video displays, actual meter readings of the internal hard and soft meters, progressive jackpot display, if linked, reason for RAM clear, and signature of the Slot Technician or above."

11. KRGC regulation K.A.R. 112-113-1(a) states that "any licensee may be sanctioned for . . . (5) failing to follow the . . . facility manager's minimum internal control system. . . ."
12. The Kansas Star Casino Slot Technician Job Description, as part of Kansas Star Casino's Internal Controls Slot Section 2, requires that slot technicians "[m]aintain records as needed."

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

13. Respondent violated KRGC regulations K.A.R. 112-104-41(b)(22), 112-113-1(a)(5), and Kansas Star Casino Internal Control Slots Section 4.G, when Respondent failed to fill out the required EGM Information Form before RAM clearing the two progressive EGMs. Because Respondent failed to complete the EGM Information Form, Kansas Star Casino does not have a document recording the date and time of the RAM clear, the EGM number, the location, the number of credits played on the EGMs before the RAM clearing occurred, the current video

displays, the previous two video displays, the actual meter readings of the internal hard and soft meters, the reason for the RAM clear, or the signature of the Respondent as the slot technician who performed the RAM clear. Because Respondent was the assigned slot technician to RAM clear the EGMs, Respondent had the duty to document all of this information and failed to do so.

14. By failing to complete the EGM Information Form, Respondent also violated the Kansas Star Casino Slot Technician Job Description Slots Section 2 because Respondent did not maintain records as needed.
15. Because Respondent failed to complete an EGM Information Form as required by KRGC regulation K.A.R. 112-104-41(b)(22) and Kansas Star Casino Internal Control Slots Section 4.G., Respondent was unable to transfer the patron contributions from those EGMs and therefore violated KRGC regulation K.A.R. 112-107-21(g)(4) and Kansas Star Casino Control Slots Section 6 L.4.c. Respondent did not transfer the progressive funds in their entirety and failed to transfer approximately \$397.21 which should have been added to the progressive jackpots.

#### STATEMENT OF POLICY

Under the Kansas Expanded Lottery Act, the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission is required to oversee the enforcement of state laws, enforcement of internal controls, and the credentialing of employees at Kansas lottery gaming facilities. The Kansas Expanded Lottery Act directed the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission to adopt rules and regulations to oversee all lottery gaming facility operations. Pursuant to this mandate, the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission created regulations that subject a licensee to sanctions, including license

suspension or revocation, when the licensee violates any provision of the Kansas Expanded Lottery Act (KELA), KRGC regulations, or a facility manager's internal controls.

By requiring licensees to adhere to KRGC regulations and the facility manager's internal controls, the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission ensures the integrity of gaming in Kansas. Regulations and internal controls regarding procedures for converting electronic gaming machines ensure each electronic gaming machine complies with all regulatory requirements when patrons play those machines. When a licensee fails to transfer patron contributions from progressive EGMs, patrons' bets are not counted toward the progressive EGMs' jackpots which directly compromises the integrity of that game. Enforcement of these provisions is necessary to ensure the integrity of gaming in the state of Kansas and protect the public interest.

#### SANCTION

16. In accordance with K.A.R. 112-113-1(e), the DRB may consider certain factors in considering appropriate sanctions, including risk to the public and to the integrity of gaming operations created by the conduct of the licensee; the nature of the violation; culpability of the licensee; any justification or excuse for the conduct; the licensee's history with respect to compliance; and corrective action taken by the licensee. Moreover, K.A.R. 112-113-1(e) states "it shall be no absolute defense that the licensee . . . inadvertently, unintentionally, or unknowingly" committed a regulatory violation and "shall affect only the degree of the sanction to be imposed. . . ."
17. The DRB considers the following factors:
  - a. Respondent's actions compromised the integrity of gaming in Kansas.  
Patrons play progressive EGMs with the expectation that every bet placed

increases the jackpot amount that can be won. Because of the Respondent, patrons' bets on the two progressive EGMs were functionally not counted which lowered the jackpot amounts that patrons could win on those machines. By failing to transfer the progressive jackpots, Respondent directly compromised the integrity of those two progressive EGMs.

- b. There is no justification or excuse for the conduct. As the Slot Technician assigned to RAM clear the EGMs, the Respondent had the duty to manually fill out an EGM Information Form. Had the Respondent completed this form, Respondent would have been able to easily transfer the progressive jackpots as required.
- c. Respondent took no corrective action. Even after RAM clearing the EGMs, Respondent could have partially completed the EGM Information Form with as much information as possible but he failed to do so. Because of the Respondent, Kansas Star Casino has no EGM Information Form for the conversion of these two progressive EGMs.
- d. The DRB has not previously issued a formal sanction to the Respondent. However, because the Respondent has been employed at Kansas Star Casino as a Slot Technician for over two years and his actions directly compromised the integrity of gaming in Kansas, the DRB considers the ordered sanction appropriate.

18. Based on the above-described findings of fact, conclusions of law, statement of policy, and sanction factors the DRB orders the Respondent to serve a two-day unpaid suspension. The two-day suspension shall total 16 hours. The dates of the

two-day unpaid suspension shall be determined by the KRGC supervising enforcement agent for the gaming facility where Respondent is employed.

19. Respondent is entitled to a hearing on the above matter, which Respondent may waive by signing and returning the enclosed Hearing Waiver to the KRGC by mail, email, or fax. (See Notice of Hearing and Right to Waive below.)
20. If Respondent waives the right to a hearing, the two-day unpaid suspension must be served within 30 days of this Order becoming final and effective. Once the suspension is served, Respondent must also send a timesheet showing the suspension occurred to the KRGC by mail, email, or fax to the address listed below within 30 days of this Order becoming final and effective.
21. If Respondent does not serve the ordered two-day unpaid suspension or does not send a timesheet showing the suspension occurred within 30 days of this Order becoming final and effective, Respondent's license will be automatically indefinitely suspended at the end of the business day without further notification or action taken by the Commission until all terms of this Order are fulfilled and the Respondent's license is reinstated by the KRGC.
22. This Order shall become part of Respondent's permanent KRGC licensing file.

#### ORDER

In accordance with the above-described findings of fact, conclusions of law, statement of policy, and sanction factors,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission suspend Respondent's license for two days.




### III. ILLEGAL GAMBLING

Following passage of expanded gaming in Kansas, the Commission became the state's go-to agency for illegal gambling questions and complaints. That role requires the KRGC to employ educational, administrative and law enforcement methods to maintain the integrity of gaming in Kansas and to help curtail illegal gambling that occurs in bars, restaurants, convenience stores and other venues throughout Kansas.

Since 2008, the Commission has received 1,737 total illegal gambling-related questions or complaints from the general public. During the third quarter of 2016, the Commission received forty-seven (47) calls and emails from the general public, down seven (7) from the previous quarter and up twenty-five (25) from the third quarter of 2015.

Of the forty-seven calls and emails received in Q-3, nine (9) involved poker runs and illegal poker rooms; eight (8) pertained to reports of various illegal gambling devices found in bars, restaurants and convenience stores; nine (9) involved raffles; four (4) involved quarter sliders; two (2) involved internet activities; and fifteen (15) calls involved miscellaneous inquiries regarding roulette, pull tabs, bingo, sports betting, video lottery, video races (dog, horse, pig), musical chairs contests, dominoes and other entertainment ventures where the legality of the activity was questioned.

#### Breakdown of illegal gambling inquiries and complaints to-date:



The above chart does not reflect calls and activity related to the following:

- Reports made to KRGC agents by other law enforcement officers around the state.
- Discussions with local law enforcement and district and county attorneys regarding the legal aspects of illegal gambling and the services that KRGC can provide.
- Time spent by agents and legal counsel to assist in active local investigations and prosecutions.
- Time spent pursuing seizures and forfeitures of illegal gambling devices.
- Inquiries from the public that are answered through access to KRGC's Illegal Gambling Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) web page. KRGC updated the FAQs portion of the webpage in late January 2014. During the thirty-two months since KRGC began tracking the new page, there have been a total of 6,176 unique page views. A total of 632 unique page views were made during the third quarter of 2016.
