Sarah Lynch-Chaput, Paralegal, reported on the Voluntary Exclusion Program statistics for the months of March, April and May 2020.

Executive Director Brownlee reported:

- The KRGK Topeka office remains closed. Governor Kelly has requested state agencies remain closed through at least the end of June, then bring back office operations gradually.

- KRGC IT Department had the agency in a good place to allow employees to work remotely.
- The Legislature adjourned *sine die* with no sports wagering legislation passed.
- The KRGC budget passed and was approved as presented; however, all state agencies have been asked to reduce spending, freeze hiring for all but essential positions, and freeze employee raises. Although KRGC is not funded through the general fund, KRGC has been asked to follow these guidelines.
- Most of the tribal casinos in Kansas have reopened.
- The Bureau of Indian Affairs has approved land in trust status in Park City, KS for the Wyandotte tribe of Oklahoma. This would open the door for the tribe to operate a casino on the land. The tribe could open a class two casino without state involvement. A class three casino would require a compact with the state.
- The decision of whether to hold the July 17, 2020 commission meeting in person or by teleconference would be decided at a later date.

Responsible Gaming Report for January 1 – June 30, 2020

Employees

During the first half of 2020, Kansas Star Casino processed 104 new team members through new hire orientation. All received the following training courses as part of orientation:

- Responsible Gaming with special emphasis on underage awareness and an overview of the Voluntary Exclusion Program
- Alcohol Awareness

In addition, team members are subject to a more intensive alcohol awareness training program called, ServSafe. Team members that are trained includes:

- All Front of House Food and Beverage team members that participate in the serving of alcoholic beverages
- All Security Staff
- All Valet Staff
- Slot Floorperson and above
- Table Games Dealers and above
- Surveillance
- All Directors

ServSafe is a three-hour course with a test at the end which team members must pass with at least a 75% score. In the first half of 2020, 35 team members took the ServSafe training and 2 team members failed and will be required to re-take until they pass the course.

Kristi Lubash, Beverage Manager, is Kansas Star Casino certified ServSafe trainer and administers all classes.

The Kansas Star Casino Responsible Gaming trainers are:

- Alecia Pray, Human Resources Manager
- Miranda Fields, Human Resources Specialist

As of June 30, 2020, Kansas Star Casino had 449 active team members and 289 furloughed.

Ongoing Training

In addition to the training given in new hire orientation, all Kansas Star Casino team members undergo annual refresher training in Responsible Gaming. To make training more accessible we have the Responsible Gaming training module online in our suite of Skillsoft courses.

The total amount spent on responsible gaming materials was \$0; \$0 was spent on ServSafe training manuals.

- Due to the Casino closure on March 18, 2020, Responsible Gaming Week was not held.

Daily Application

While all departments and team members are actively involved in preventing underage, intoxicated and self-excluded patrons from entering the casino floor and from gambling if they do gain access, the Security Officers stationed at the gated entrances are the primary method of prevention. Security follows the property's policy of checking IDs for people who appear 30 or younger; the statistics for these ID checks during the first half of 2020 are:

- Underage individuals denied gaming floor access: 100
- People denied access for not having ID: 482
- People denied for invalid ID: 248
- Intoxicated individuals denied gaming floor access: 55
- VEPs denied access to the gaming floor: 0

Further, there were 109 intoxicated individuals ejected from the casino, 8 VEPs were removed and turned over to the KRGC and the Mulvane Police Department; 2 underage persons were caught and ejected from the casino. Also, 94 persons were removed from the casino for a variety of reasons.

During the first half of 2020, there were 594,613 guests who entered the casino floor. Security team members checked 72,689 IDs. In addition, 18 ID checks took place on the gaming floor in situations involving suspected minors.

Several other ongoing efforts are noteworthy as the Kansas Star Casino is an active member and participant in the Kansas Coalition on Problem Gambling, Problem Gambling Program Committee and the South-Central Task Force on Problem Gambling.

Responsible Gambling Plan Semi-Annual Report
January 1, 2020 thru June 30, 2020

1. Employees

At the end of the reporting period, Hollywood Casino has a total of 560 employees. Of those, 271 are active and there are 289 employees that are currently still on furlough. During the reporting period, 87 employees were hired.

2. Responsible Gaming Training:

All employees hired during the reporting period received initial training on responsible gaming during property orientation. This consisted of approximately 30 minutes dedicated to responsible gaming. All employees successfully completed this training.

Of those new hires, 29 were hired into positions which require additional training to understand the proper procedures for responsible alcohol service. All of those employees successfully completed the TiPS training prior to our closure.

In addition, there were 7 existing employees who attended and successfully completed refresher TiPS training prior to our closure.

As a result of our closure related to the Covid-19 pandemic, there were 77 existing employees whose TiPS Certification expired during that time. We are currently working with our reps at TiPS to obtain etips gaming passports and to get one of our certified trainer's license renewed in order to complete this training for those employees.

Prior to the pandemic, we had five certified TiPS trainers on property. Currently, we only have one.

We are transitioning to an on-line training thru TiPS which will allow employees to be certified by taking on-line courses.

3. Statistics:

To assist in tracking the success of the Responsible Gaming Plan, Hollywood Casino maintains statistics related to responsible gaming. Some of the numbers from the reporting period include:

- Hollywood Casino refused entry to 80 minors who attempted to gain access to the property.
- No minors successfully entered the casino during the period.
- In addition, Hollywood Casino either refused entry to or removed from the property 160 individuals who appeared to be under the influence of alcohol.
- In addition to training officers to be observant at the casino entrances, Hollywood Casino has procedures in place to identify VEPs when they attempt to cash a

check, perform a cash advance, attempt to claim a taxable jackpot, or attempt to create a Marquee Rewards (player club) account. During the reporting period, Hollywood Casino discovered 21 VEPs on property. The local KRGC Agent on Duty was contacted immediately in each of these instances and took custody of the VEP for processing.


III. ILLEGAL GAMBLING

The Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission (KRGC) provides resources and assistance to local law enforcement, prosecutors, and the public on illegal gambling questions, education, and complaints. The KRGC responds to email and phone complaints and inquiries, conducts continuing legal education seminars for prosecutors, assists local law enforcement agencies with illegal gambling investigations, and conducts civil seizures of illegal gambling devices for forfeiture, all in an effort to curtail illegal gambling in bars, restaurants, convenience stores, and other venues throughout Kansas.

Since 2008, the Commission has received 2,308 total illegal gambling-related questions or complaints from the general public. Much of the state of Kansas was shut down during the second quarter of 2020 as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. However, KRGC continued to respond to illegal gambling inquiries and investigate illegal gambling complaints from the public and other law enforcement agencies. During the second quarter (Q-2) of 2020, the Commission received thirty-one (31) calls and emails from the general public, down twenty-two (22) from the previous quarter and down fourteen (14) from the second quarter of 2019.

Of the thirty-one (31) calls and emails received in Q-2, seven (7) involved raffles; twelve (12) involved slot machines; one (1) involved internet gambling; and eleven (11) involved other types of gambling. Of the eleven (11) other calls received, four (4) involved bingo; five (5) involved the legality of different fundraising ideas; one (1) involved fantasy sports; and one (1) involved e-sports.

Breakdown of illegal gambling inquiries and complaints to-date:



The above chart does not reflect calls and activity related to the following:

- Reports made to KRGC agents by other law enforcement officers around the state.
- Discussions with local law enforcement and district and county attorneys regarding the legal aspects of illegal gambling and the services that KRGC can provide.

- Time spent by agents and legal counsel to assist in active local investigations and prosecutions.
- Time spent pursuing seizures and forfeitures of illegal gambling devices.
- Inquiries from the public that are answered through access to KRGCC's Illegal Gambling Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) web page.

KRGCC updated the Illegal Gambling FAQs portion of the webpage in late January 2014. During the six-and-a-half years since KRGCC began tracking the new page, there have been a total of 20,363 unique page views. A total of 657 unique page views were made during the second quarter of 2020, down 200 from the previous quarter and down 139 from the previous year.
